

### FOR CANADIAN PACIFIC TEST



Picturd above is a 1,500-horse power diesel road engine of the type which will be tested early this month under actual traffic conditions by the Canadian Pacific Railway. The locomotive can be used singly or in connected units of two or three, developing full 4,500-horse power in the latter case. Future of the steam-powered"iron horse" in Canada may well depend upon results of these tests. The Canadian Pacific is already turning heavily to use of diesel locomotives for yard use throughout the entire system.

## Aviation Honours for Champion of the Blades




