Inspects Cadets of Three Towns on Parade Here

North Bay Pipe Band Leads Corps on March Past; Boys Congratulated by Officer

Local residents saw an interesting display on Friday evening when the annual inspection of the Cobalt-Haileybury-New Liskeard Cadet Corps was held at the local Armories, and which included a march of the cadets through a part of the town, led by the Canadian Legion Pipe Band of North Bay.

The inspecting officer, who took the salute during the march past, was Major F. G. C. Darton, M.B.E.A. The cadets, formerly M.S.B.E.A. by the high schools in the three towns, are now attached to "C" Company of the Algonquin Regiment and the corps is No. 2344. The ceremony included a demonstration of the use of mortars and other weapons by the boys, and the inspecting officer complimented them on the progress that had been made since they were taken under the wing of the Reserve Company.

Captain of the Cadet Corps is Bill Herron of Haileybury, with Lieut. Ralph Fraboni of Cobalt as second in command. The sergeant-major is R. O'Grady, also of Haileybury, and the chief instructor of the corps is Major F. L. Charbonneau of the Algonquins.

After the inspection and parade had been completed, the Pipe Band went to Misericordia Hospital, where they gave a concert for the benefit of the patients there and in St. Mary's on the Lake Sanatorium. This part of the program provided a special treat to those who are compelled to spend their time in the institutions and was greatly appreciated.

A detachment of 13 cadets from the corps will go to Ipperwash military camp for a training period from July 26th to August 14. They will receive instructions in vehicle driving and other phases of military training.

Dies In Hospital After Air Trip From Labrador

Late Wilmer Ross a Member of Old Haileybury Family; Funeral This Afternoon

Wilmer Burton Ross, eldest son of Mrs. H. M. Ross and the late Mr. Ross, old residents of Haileybury, died suddenly in St. Luke's Hospital, Montreal, on Sunday night, June 10th. He had been taken ill at his work with an iron mining company at Seven Islands, Labrador, and flown from there to the hospital, according to word reaching his mother and other members of the family on Monday.

Mr. Ross had been home for a visit in April and had left May 1st to return to his post as chief storeman for the company, and at that time had been in his usual health.

Born at Nipissing, Ont., on October 21st, 1906, Mr. Ross came to Haileybury with his parents at an early age. He received his education in the local public and high schools, and from 1922 until a short time ago had been associated with the Northern Canada Supply Company, with the exception of four years spent in the army during the Second World War. He was unmarried.

Surviving Mr. Ross are his mother, six sisters and three brothers. His father, the late Hugh M. Ross, died in August, 1950. The sisters are Mrs. Bernice McKinley, Hamilton; Mrs. Ted Morrow (Gladys), Yakima, Wash.; Miss Alyce, at home; Mrs. Ken. Buffam (Erline) Cobalt; Mrs. Gilbert Doyle (Joyce), Montreal, and Miss Marna, with the ONR at Kirkland Lake. The brothers are Ronald, Yellowknife; John D. Montreal, and Ivan, Sydney, N.S. With the exception of Mrs. Morrow and Ivan, all were expected to be home for the funeral, which is being held this afternoon. The service will be held in St. Paul's Church at 3 o'clock, and will be conducted by the rector, Rev. Canon Goodier. Interment will be in Mount Pleasant cemetery.

The community joins in extending sincere sympathy to Mrs. Ross and her family in their sorrow.

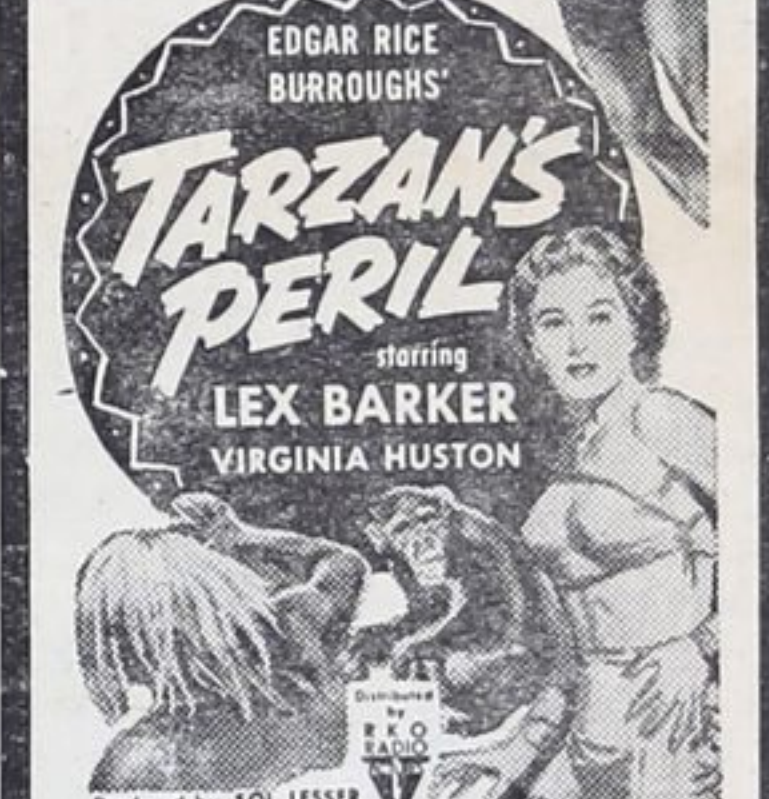
