NEW SIDEWALK PLOW HAS BEEN ADDED TO TOWN'S EQUIPMENT

The amount of snow that fell last week-end gave the municipal workmen a chance to try out the new "Snow-boy" sidewalk snow blower.

The blower is powered by a gasoline 12-h.p. motor and just requires guiding. It makes a very good job, on dry snow especially, and top speed is three miles per hour. In heavier snow the speed would be reduced.

It should prove very valuable in the winter months, and is primarily intended for use where road traffic is heavy. The use of this plow will please parents of school children, as it will not be necessary for them to walk in the middle of the road as hitherto.

The new pumps for the pump-house have arrived and installation will be starting on these shortly. Control lines, controlling the automatic system are being installed by the Northern Telephone Company at present.

Sergt. Johnson of O.P.P. Loses Brother in Toronto

Sergeant Russell E. Johnson of the Ontario Provincial Police office here, received the sad news

of the death of a brother, Harry H. Johnson, 60, veteran Toronto newspaper man, who died Tuesday at Streetsville, near the city.

The late Mr. Johnson worked for many years on the old Mail and Empire, and was city editor of the Toronto Star for about nine years.

He became executive secretary of the Ontario Liberal Association in 1933 and was given much credit for the election of Mitchell F. Hepburn as Ontario Premier the following year. In 1943, he quit politics to do public relations work for Algoma Steel Corporation, a position he held until his death.
