Canada's Governor-General, His Excellency the Rt. Hon. Vincent Massey, P.C., C.H., has accepted the appointment of Chief Scout of Canada.

Canadian Boy Scout membership reached 128,760 by the end of 1951, an increase of 11,000 over the 1950 total. Included are 70,348 Wolf Cubs, 42,636 Boy Scouts, 614 Scouts, 794 Lone Scouts, 2,426 Rover Scouts, 81 Rover Sea Scouts and 11,861 adult leaders.

Eight Canadians are planning to attend the First World Scouters' Indaba, the equivalent of a Jamboree for Scouts, at Gilwell Park, near London, England, next July 15th to 24th. To date, 16 countries have promised to send representatives to the unique camp gathering.

THE BOOK NOOK

"Hudson's Bay Trader"

In this personal diary of a year spent at a Hudson's Bay Company fur trading post in Baffin's Land, Lord Tweedsmuir, son of Canada's former Governor-General has written a vivid first-hand description of the life led by fur traders, trappers, hunters and Eskimos.

From 1938 to 1939, he worked in the far North and was so completely cut off from the outside world that he knew nothing of such historic and momentous events as Munich and the German march into Czechoslovakia.

But the fur trader's country did not lack adventure, excitement and some danger. It was a world of its own where a man had to be self-reliant. As the author shows, mere knowledge of trading was not enough. At different times, the fur trader must be a naturalist and a linguist; a hunter and a trapper; a marksman and a navigator.

This enthralling travel book and exciting adventure story follows the high literary tradition of the author's father, John Buchan. Thus, it was particularly appropriate that, after the author had joined the Canadian Army, it was John Buchan who discovered the manuscript of the diary and had it typed. He used much of the material in it to give him the authentic background and the local color for his last novel "Sick Heart River".

"Hudson's Bay Trader" is illustrated by more than 80 photographs, most of which were taken by the author.

OBITUARY

MARTIN HANTSKE

The death occurred on Sunday, March 16th, 1952, of Martin Hantske in his eighty-second year. Mr. Hantske came to Canada from Germany about sixty-four years ago and arrived in Haileybury in 1904, where he has had his home ever since. He was a bricklayer and stone mason by trade.

He is survived by his wife, the former Louisa Jonus, whom he married in Pembroke; one daughter, Mrs. C. Enright of Toronto; and three sons, Herbert, of Timmins, Alfred of Timmins and Leonard of Vancouver.

The funeral service was held Wednesday afternoon at 3 p.m. from the Tulloch Funeral Chapel. The pallbearers were Mr. John Creighton, Mr. Albert Speicher and Mr. Thos. Hibbert of Haileybury and Mr. N. McLeod of Cobalt.

During his long residence here Mr. Hantske endeared himself to all classes for his quiet, friendly manner, and his interest in sport.
