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THE JET AGE

While the President of Avro Canada was addressing the Canadian Club, a Canadian jet fighter could take off from Malton, flip over the Royal York Hotel, straighten out for Ottawa, encircle Parliament Hill and be back before the speaker was finished.

This example of jet speed is not a fantasy but a fact. The other day a jet pilot, at an altitude of eight miles from the earth and on a clear day, saw Montreal and Toronto at the same time.

The Jet story is a story of magnificent Canadian accomplishment and Canadians need never again regard themselves as members of a branch office in the international aviation industry.

Avro's new engine, the Orenda, is referred to with superlatives by aviation authorities. Our jetliner is the envy of the transport world.

Our jet fighter stands supreme among its type of aircraft. Avro Canada can quickly shatter the illusion that Canada's young university graduates must look south of the border for a future career.

The time of aircraft consisting of a frame and an engine and a propeller is no more. The designing of Canada's Jetliner took some 700,000 manhours—more than is required for such a large building as Toronto's Bank of Commerce.

It has seven and a half miles of wiring, over 16,000 electrical connections and over twelve hundred other electrical items—and has more instruments than twenty Diesel locomotives.

A typical fighter of World War II had a fighting altitude of 25,000 feet. The CF-100 is right at home in the stratosphere.

one did 400 miles an hour. The new one does 650-plus. Unlike the old type, the CF-100 with radar and other special equipment, is available round the clock in any weather.

The United States Sabre has a relatively limited range. In developing the Canadian jet fighter the CF-100, the vast distance involved in the air defence of our country had to be considered—long range operation and still capable of terrific speed was required.

MINING NOTES

1848—Montreal Mining Company commenced mining at Bruce Mines, Ontario.

1850—Indians located Douglas coal seam at Nanaimo, B.C.

1852—August 24, J. W. McKay, Hudson's Bay Co. factor sent by James Douglas from Victoria to take possession of Nanaimo coal field and collect royalty from users of coal.

Free gold discovered in quartz at Mitchell Harbour, Queen Charlotte Islands, causing the first auriferous quartz rush in British Columbia.

1853—March 26, Governor Jas.

Douglas, Victoria, issued, as Lieutenant-Governor of Queen Charlotte Island, Crown Colony, the first proclamation relating to mining in British Columbia.

1855—Placer gold found at the mouth of the Pend d'Oreille river B.C., by ex-servants of the Hudson Bay Co. at Fort Colville.

1857—Sir James Hunter located coal on Souris River, Man.
