NORRIS J. BLANCHETTE

A Select Committee of the Legislative Assembly has been appointed to enquire into and review The Companies Act of the Province of Ontario and related Acts, including The Extra-provincial Corporations Act, The Companies Information Act, and The Mortmain and Charitable Uses Act and regulations made thereunder, with a view to recommending improvements in this Legislation.

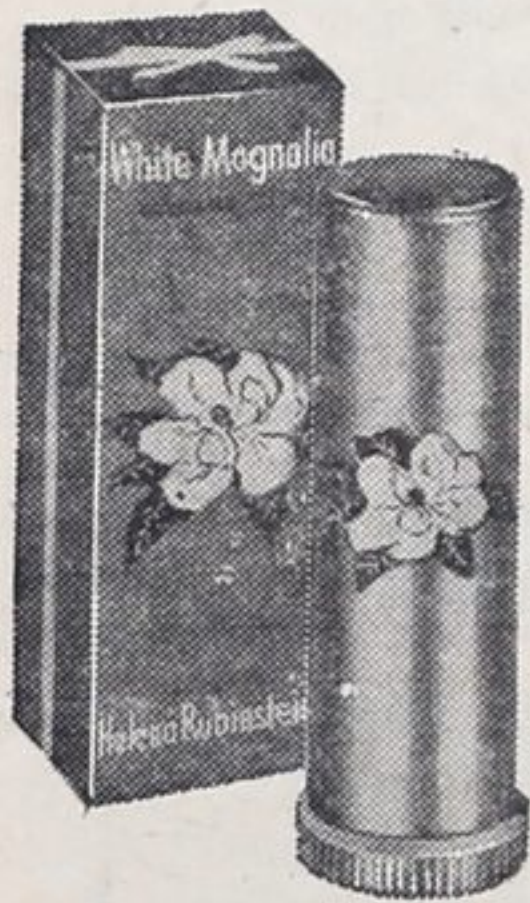
