Equal Freight Rates Favored for Some Goods

The railways generally are in favor of equalizing freight rates on many basic commodities where it will be to the general welfare of the country as a whole, J. A. Argo, assistant vicepresident, traffic, Canadian National Railways, told members of the Canadian Industrial Traffic League here recently.

He said that while such action is bound to hurt some, it might be in the best interests of Canadian industrial development as a whole and added that based on sound equalization principles, it would not seriously affect the railways unless it disrupted the economy of the country or forced traffic to move via other forms of transportation.

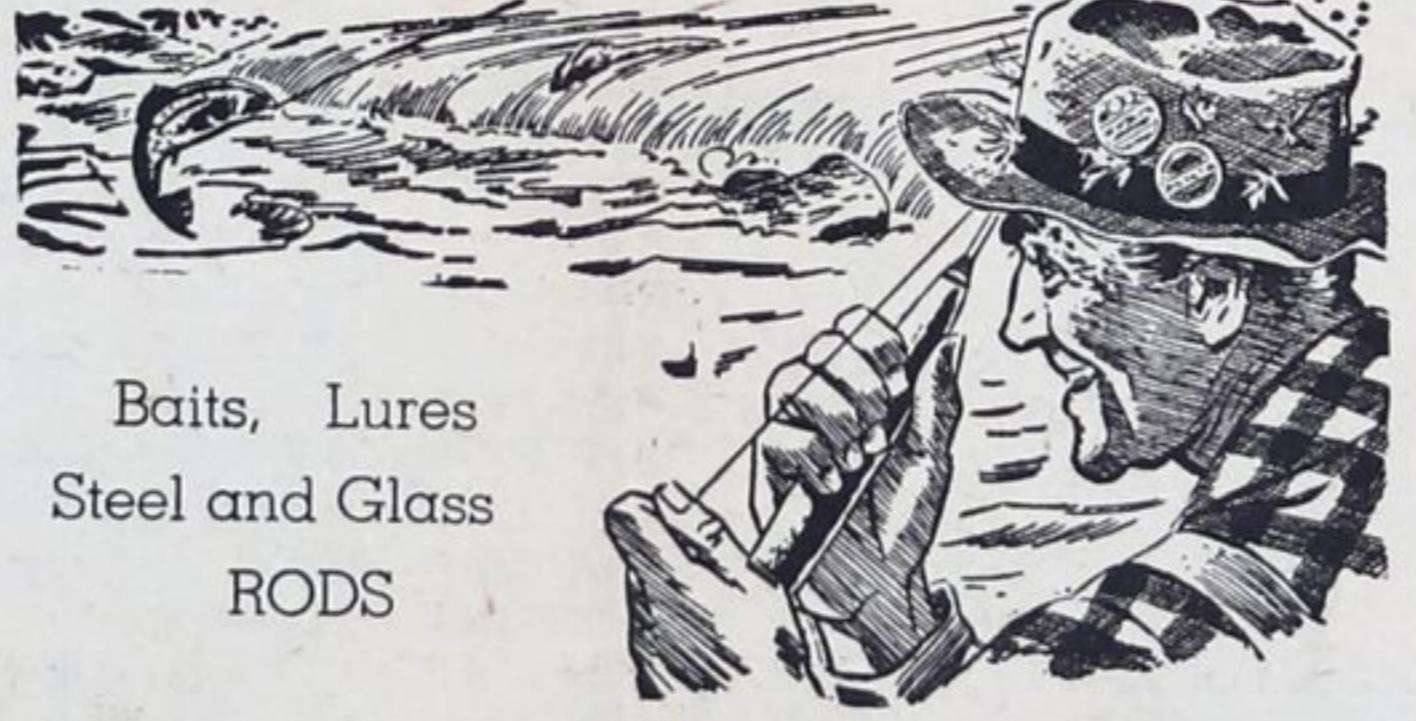
