The most efficient and safe means of destroying caterpillars is to use common insecticides such as DDT or lead arsenate.

Radishes to be mild, tender and attractive, must be grown rapidly. If grown too slowly or checked in growth, the roots become pungent, tough and pithy.

Flea beetles Colorado beetles, leafhoppers and aphids—the major insect pests attacking the Canadian potato crop—can be controlled with one insecticide—DDT. Those who prefer to dust may use a three per cent DDT dust while those who favor spraying have a choice of a 50 per cent DDT wettable powder or a 25 per cent DDT emulsion.
