Edward Butler
Word was received recently of the death of Edward Butler at Sunnybrook Hospital, Toronto. Mr. Butler was in his seventy-second year.

Born in Kilkenny, Ireland, he enlisted in the armed services in February, 1915, and served with the 15th Battalion, C.E.F., and among other decorations was awarded the 1914-15 Mons Star.

Mr. Butler was well known in Cobalt and Haileybury as his interest was in mining in his earlier years. Later he was connected with the Canadian Splint factory.
