

Seek Assistance From Ottawa for Northern Areas

Spearheaded by Mayor J. W. Spooner of Timmins, a united appeal will be made to Ottawa concerning the price of gold as it adversely affects Northern municipalities.

Mayor Spooner and Reeve Ann Shipley met in Kirkland Lake last week to discuss the situation. Ottawa has advised Mrs. Shipley that federal officials are prepared to meet the delegation from the North on November 10.

All indications point to the solid backing of all Northeastern Ontario municipalities and other gold mining areas as well, to this forward step to do something about the increasingly grave situation. Red Lake indicated last week that it is anxious to join in the representation. Mayor Spooner also anticipates the support of municipalities in the northern areas of the province, not necessarily regarded as mining centres.

The Mayor stated that the Northern Ontario-wide appeal to Ottawa would be made strictly at the municipal level. The gold mining situation, he intimated, has developed to a point where it poses a threat to the very existence of the mining industry. "It should be understood that we are not going to the government to suggest what steps they should take. We have every confidence in our elected representatives but we do propose to outline the gravity of the situation."

When the brief is drafted, it will be representative of the thoughts of municipalities, labour, Chamber of Commerce and other important bodies.

Biggest Month in Ontario's Travel History

The biggest single month in Ontario's travel history was recorded in August of this year when 338,682 American tourist automobiles entered the Province, the Department of Travel and Publicity reports. This represents an increase of 12,263 or 4.1 per cent over the same month of 1951. Up to now August, 1951, had been the record month.

For the first eight months of 1952, the number of motor cars in on tourist permits stands at a record-breaking 1,071,336, up to 4.5 per cent over the same period of 1951.
