Record of Musical Awards Reveals Canada Grows Up

Dr. Edward Johnson, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Royal Conservatory of Music of Toronto, and former general manager of the Metropolitan Opera Company of New York recently took the role of international music contest winners among Conservatory graduates. He found the record to be overwhelming. Within the past two years Betty Jean Hagen, violinist, Lois Marshall, soprano, Marguerite Gignac, soprano, and Clermont Pepin, composer, have won awards in cities as far afield as New York, Paris, London and and Florence. The latest distinction was gained by Ray Dudley, brilliant young pianist from Bowmanville, Ont., who on October 3rd won the first place medal in the Geneva, Switzerland international contest for pianoforte performers. Dr. Johnson, the Conservatory faculty and all serious Canadian musicians and music lovers are indeed proud of the achievements accorded the young artists.

It has in the past been too common a practice for our young musicians to look towards the United States, Great Britain or continental Europe as places to receive the best in musical training. All these award winners were trained in Canada and are graduates of the Senior School of the Royal Conservatory (now a part of the Faculty of Music in the Conservatory's reorganization Modern Taxi plan).
