Funeral Services Held on Tuesday for North's Sheriff

Funeral services were held at St. Paul's Anglican Church on Tuesday afternoon for the late George Caldbick, whose death occurred suddenly at his home on Browning street on Saturday morning. He was eighty-four years of age and would have been eighty-five in January.

Born in Hastings County, Mr Caldbick began his career in 10-ronto, where he served for eight years with the police force. In 1905, he came to Cobalt, where he had accepted an appointment as a provincial constable. He continued for a time in that capacity during the active days of Cobalt's mining boom before receiving an appointment as chief of the Provincial Force in Northern Ontario. Later, he became an inspector at a time when there was only two of those officers—one covering Southern Ontario and the other in the North Country. His duties took him to all parts of the vast area under his supervision.

With the formation of the District of Temiskaming in 1912 Mr Caldbick was appointed Sheriff. He conducted the affairs of the district from the Court House here until his retirement in 1935. He was a member of St. Paul's Anglican Church. He was a member of Temiskaming Lodge A. F. & A. M., New Liskeard, Silver Lodge, A.F. & A.M. Cobalt and the Royal Arch Chapter and Past Preceptor of Temiskaming Preceptory here. He was at one time an active member of the Haileybur Curling Club.

His wife the former Catherine M. Smith predeceased him in 1950.

Surviving him are three daughters, Mrs. C. E. Taylor (Margaret) of Timmins, Mrs. A. E. Cain (Jane) of Timmins, Mrs. J. H. L. Brennan (Helen) of Toronto; and four sons: S. A. Caldbick, Q.C., of Timmins; Joseph of Seattle, Washington, Dr. Geo Caldbick of Ottawa and Ward of Montreal. Also surviving him are fourteen grandchildren and two great grandchildren.
