Council Plans to Terminate Ten Years of Supervision

Contrary to popular opinion, a so-called surplus does not exist. Any yearly surplus is automatically absorbed in the next year's budget. The post-war fund which now exists does so because of funds derived from the old Housing Commission created after the fire and has become known as an emergency fund. With that fund, the new gym was financed by Town buying of debentures and payment was made on a considerable amount of work on the pump house.

With one dissenting voice, that of Charles Camsell, application will be made to the Department of Municipal Affairs and to the Ontario Municipal Board for termination of special jurisdiction by the said Department over the town of Haileybury.

A letter from O.E. Walli, Mining School Principal, was read in which he requested the privilege

of speaking to council at the February meeting concerning a proposed sidewalk for Latchford street. Some four years ago residents of Latchford petitioned for a sidewalk and with only one exception, all property owners signed a petition. "I believe" said Mr. Walli, "that at that time council made a study of costs and decided the time was not ripe for action".

Mr. Walli suggested that council build one block per year. In this way, he said, cost would not be prohibitive. He pointed out that a sidewalk was needed badly in the first block. Pedestrians must use the road all the time and children are in constant danger of traffic accidents. The street serves the Mining School which is an important public building with frequent visitors.

The Rotary Club visited to the town that allowance be made this year for the purchase of a power lawn mower. The cost of the upkeep of the park is considerable and the machine could be used for all the various work of this nature necessary in town.

Taxi licenses will be renewed if the municipal detachment OPP have no objection.

An offer of \$1,000 cash from A.E. Vannier for the Thisdelle house on Elliott street was accepted providing the committee of A. H. Cooke and D. H. Millar, chosen to examine the property, approve.

G. S. Faulkner asked for an easement to connect to the sewer serving lot 42, Plan M-37. Mr.

Faulkner recently purchased the home of Mrs. R. Gilmour. This matter was held over pending a study of the situation by the Foreman.

The Chamber of Commerce request that allowance be made in the budget for \$50.00 to assist in the publishing of their yearly bulletin was approved.

The Legion thanked council for their assistance with the annual Christmas party.

An order was placed for a 500-

gallon capacity booster tank for the fire truck costing in the neighborhood of \$130.00. The suggestion was made by Councillor Leo Gough last year for a new tank—at present where there is no hydrant available, the fire truck can only go with 80 gallons which it was felt was inadequate. Federal Member Walter Little will be asked to assist in the repair of the breakwater and dock which the Mayor said "were in deplorable condition".
