### Englehart Man Victim of Shooting on Hunting Trip

Robert Smith, 38-year-old Englehart man died in the Englehart hospital last week, the victim of a tragic hunting accident. Mr. Smith, with his two hunting companions, Stanley Pahualski, 41, of Evanturel Township and Nick Nychuk of Englehart was hunting in Pacaud Township about 14 miles from the Railway Town. The three were sitting in the car when Smith who was alone in the back seat handed his gun to Nychuk to be unloaded as Smith knew little of firearms. Nychuk's own rifle was in the front seat of the car with the butt resting on the floor under the dash and the muzzle resting against the front seat.

Nychuk's 30-30 rifle suddenly went off and the bullet tore through the back seat and entered Smith's chest. His companions rushed him to the Englehart hospital, arriving at noon where Dr. J.J. Higgins removed the bullet and gave blood transfusions.
