The happy couple came to the North in 1919 and settled in North Cobalt in 1922. They have four daughters, seven sons and thirty-five grandchildren

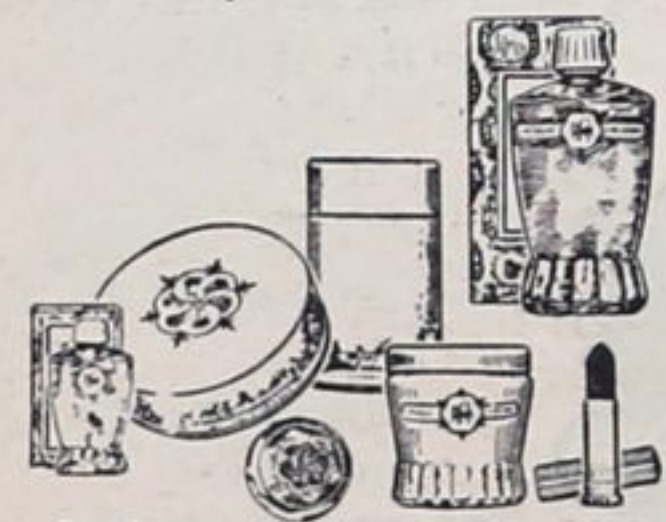

chants guaranteed \$200.00 each. Would merchants here be prepared to put up such a sum? Isn't it up to the Chamber of Commerce?

Hold over until next meeting an offer from J. W. N. Bell to purchase the Town's dismantled stoker for \$25.00.

Were informed by the Mayor that he understood Councillor Alex Mosher had instructed the Hydro to cease work on the lighting plan since he had several changes to make. Mr. Day expressed concern that such arbitrary action should be taken—to give orders of this nature without consulting Council. Mr. Millar said that "if Mr. Mosher thinks changes should be made, we should listen to him." The Mayor agreed but pointed out firmly "in the proper manner." The report, he continued, was approved, voted upon and adopted. Is it proper if one or two disagree with previous plans, that one man can countermand the order? The Chairman of Light has a perfect right to bring recommendations to Council and then Hydro can be notified in the proper way."

Mr. Gardner excused Mr. Mosher on the grounds that, like himself he was green to the Council table that he had had nothing to do with the original plan and that if he thought he could improve things, alright. Mr. Camsell who was on the original Light Committee with Mr. Day, said "I do not think Mr. Mosher meant to override Council. He only wants to hold things up until we reconsider it." Mr. Day

said that it was months since Hydro had been advised to put in the lights. Mr. Millar told the Mayor that his attitude was not right and that it wouldn't hurt them to wait. Mr. Day said that "if it might have been justifiable were they now (since Mr. Mosher had not been at the meeting) to wait for another month until the next meeting?" Mr. Gardner remarked "We've done without lights for twenty-five years, another month won't hurt" and they adjourned and darkness fell on the Town hall although the street lights still burnt merrily on the corner.
