COLONEL F. WHITE GALLANT D-DAY HERO DIES IN OTTAWA

Lt. Col. Frank E. White, DSO whose official citation recorded one of the most gallant exploits of a Canadian soldier during the invasion of Europe on "D Day" died last week in Ottawa.
