N. J. Everard Dies In Victoria City

A former resident of Haileybury, Nutcombe J. Everard, died last week in Victoria, B.C., where he has resided for the past fourteen years.

Born in Somerset, England, he was the fourth son of Captain Courtney Everard, R.N., a veteran of the Crimean War. Mr. Everard was educated at Sherbourne College and later went to New Zealand to attend the Mining School at Wihī. Shortly before the First War he came Canada and was associated with the late J. Mackintosh Bell, and was at the Keeley, North Thompson and Vipond Mines. Later, he was field engineer for Huronian Belt and then was in private practice in Haileybury.

He is survived by his wife, the former Kathleen Johnston, two brothers, H. N. Everard, Kent, England, H. E. Everard, Somerset, England and one sister, Gertrude Everard of Somerset, England.
