On Monday evening, October 18th, two distinguished duo-pianists who also happen to be identical twins will open the ninth season of Temiskaming Community Concerts Association at the New Liskeard Memorial Hall. Of the many facets of their art, that the critics usually single out for special praise is the quality of their tonal output.

The Mauneys make their homes on Long Island, close enough for convenience in practicing, far enough apart to avoid complete confusion. In the basement of Ernest's house, they have ingeniously constructed a sound-proof studio. The studio is so divided that they can practice separately at the same time or they can quickly push the two pianos together when they want ensemble. At the beginning of the program, they will settle the big question that automatically arises in the spectator's mind by announcing "I'm Ernest" "I'm Miles. But you will have to keep your eyes open and you wits about you. For when they return to the stage after intermission or even after retiring at the end of a group of numbers they are apt to exchange pianos.

Born in King's Mountain North Carolina they began studying piano at an early age with their mother. While in High School they worked for several summer seasons at the Juillard School of Music in New York under Arthur Newstead. In 1927 they graduated from the Oberlin Conservatory of Music. Their current season opened auspiciously with an appearance as soloists with the Cleveland Summer Orchestra and is heavily booked.

"No person, during the closed season for deer or moose shall have in his possession between one-half hour before sunrise any one-half hour after sunset any device capable of throwing or casting rays of light upon an object and any rifle or other firearm capable of killing deer or moose, unless the rifle or other firearm is unloaded and encased, or is dismantled.

"In any locality which game usually inhabits or in which game is usually found, no person shall have any air-gun, gun, rifle or firearm in his possession in a place from which game may be shot, unless it is unloaded and encased or it is dismantled, between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise of any day except as may be provided by the regulations: R.S.O., c. 163, s.46, cl. (a).

The LETTER BOX

Dear Madam:—

In their complacent survey at last week's meeting of Council, of the many pleasant features that go to make Haileybury a good town, our Town Fathers mention our sidewalks. It may be safe to wager that in no town of comparable size in Ontario, will there be found sidewalks like ours.

Consider, for instance, the sidewalk that, until very recently pursued its casual way up the gentle slope of Temiskaming Street. Built originally in 1910 by Mr. C. A. Foster—at his own expense—, repaired from time to time, but never entirely replaced, it served us well. It survived the fire—through the ingenuity and fortitude of the late Mr. Christopher Mann whose hop-vine clad cottage nestled half-way up the hill. Halted by his challenge, in the cold, gray dawn of October 15th, 1922, the local "Safety Patrol" found him with shot-gun and water-pail, his keen grey eyes alert for marauders or incipient blaze. (He did not say "incipient") He had been around and well he knew what evil might be afoot! Like Casabianca, he had kept lonely vigil all that awful night. 'Twas a land-mark! 'Twas the envy of our Liskeard friends who were wont to refer to it as the "fish ladder." It is true there

was the odd plank missing here and there, and one had to be quick on the hop, step and jump, but it obviated further need for physical jerks.

It was a good little sidewalk and we watched its passing—on the Town truck—with regret.
