Salvation Army Marks 47 Years of Service Here

Forty-seven years ago, on the streets of Haileybury a strange sight met the eyes of many who were wending their way home or were out for an evening's walk.

On one of the corners of the old Haileybury stood a lassie in a large bonnet, emblazoned with a ribbon reading "The Salvation Army" and also to be seen was a man with a cap, similar in design to the railway conductor's of today.

These people were the pioneers of an organization which has spread to every country but the iron curtain countries. Since that beginning, Haileybury has had many Salvation Army officers stationed in command of the Corps, a number of them rising to high positions in Army ranks.

The Army history in the town has not been without its sorrows. During the great fire, the people were to lose their hal and for many years afterwards were in temporary quarters.

This month marks the 47th anniversary of The Salvation Army in Haileybury and although many things in The Army have changed, such as the smarter uniforms, the message of The Army is still the same and will continue to be the same. Coming to conduct the anniversary week-end of the local Corps will be a man who is a native of Canada and who has risen in the Army to hold some of the important positions in this country and in other lands.
