

Christmas Seal Drive to Open Monday Morning

On Monday, November 15th the annual Christmas Seal campaign will open in this district. Preparatory to the drive, the Association held a meeting in New Liskeard last week with the following members present: W. E. Anderson, President; Mrs. J. B. Battson, Secretary, both of New Liskeard; Mrs. D. J. Paterson, Englehart; P. J. Lemon, Cobalt; J. H. Hughes, Haileybury; E. Denston and Mrs. G. Hall, Kirkland Lake; J. S. Taylor of Virgintown; G. B. Murdoch of Larder Lake.

Statistics show that tuberculosis caused 1,810 deaths in Canada last year—the lowest number on record—despite the fact that the population is increasing. With this rate, Canada becomes one of four nations with the world's lowest tuberculosis death rate. Denmark, home of the Christmas Seal, is the lowest and has been for many years. Because the saving of life is advancing more rapidly than prevention of the disease, there were 11,000 new cases of TB in Canada. It can readily be understood then, why we should give generously in this fight to better health. Early discovery means less time spent in the Sanatorium and it is encouraging to note that the free chest clinics throughout the district were well attended last year.

During the next two weeks, a colored film will be available to interested groups. Those wishing to make use of this "All Ontario Film" are advised to contact their local committee member.

Again this year, any Sanatorium patient whose homes are in Northern Ontario will be given a \$10.00 Christmas gift certificate regardless of where they may now be hospitalized.

Reorganized last year to include the whole of the District of Temiskaming and Temagami the Association has gained strength in every phase of its work. This year a three language letter to cover all peoples in a single effort has been printed in French, English and Polish. For the convenience of contributors, blank cheques have been enclosed to eliminate cash donations for safety's sake.

The Christmas Seal depicts a group of healthy youngsters around their Christmas tree. You are protecting this same happy group in years to come by giving generously to the Christmas Seal fund.

There are 29 cities, 145 towns, 156 villages and 571 townships in Ontario.
