

Temiskaming Fish and Game Award Prizes at Meeting

Sportsmen from all sections of Temiskaming district were on hand Friday night at the Cobalt Community Hall for the annual fall meeting of the Temiskaming Fish and Game Association.

Prizes in the Association's annual fishing competition were awarded as follows:

LAKE TROUT

First prize — 21 1/2 pounds, caught by Louis Lingenfelter in Trout Lake.

Second prize — 17 pounds. Caught by Mrs. Cliff Lowery in Lake Temagami.

Third Prize—16 lbs. caught by Lester Clark in Lake Animapissing.

SPECKLED TROUT

First Prize—3 lbs. 4 ozs., caught by D. G. Sharp in Wabi River.

Second Prize—Also 3 pounds, 4 ozs., caught by Arnold Nelson in Mowat Lake.

Third Prize—3 lbs., caught by Eric Soderstrom in Loon Lake, Silver Centre.

PICKEREL

First Prize—12 lbs., caught by George Lawson at Twin Lakes.

Second Prize—7 lbs., caught by Don Hebner in Granite Lake.

Third Prize—6 lbs., 2 ozs., caught by Lewis Simard in the White River.

BLACK BASS

First Prize—5 lbs. 2 ozs., taken by Alex Brown at Mattawapika Falls.

Second Prize—3 lbs., 9 ozs., caught by C. O. Barlow in Fairy Lake.

Third Prize—2 lbs. 12 ozs., caught by Don Hebner in Lake Temiskaming.

Hugh Armstrong, Norman Abraham and Gordon Short were appointed to a sub-committee to meet with the district biologist to look over certain lakes in the immediate area to determine the possibility of having them poisoned and re-stocked to encourage better fishing. Tests will be made to determine what type of fish would be best suited for these lakes.

The question of getting wild rice to plant in marshes throughout the district to promote better duck hunting was brought up once again and although the Department of Lands and Forests officials advised it was almost

impossible to obtain a visitor suggested contacting a firm in Western Canada who, he felt sure, could supply any quantity.

The Department's system of re-stocking lakes by aircraft came in for considerable criticism and many members felt that lakes accessible by road should be re-stocked by trucks as in the past.

Members also felt that more fish should be made available for this district from the Hills' Lake hatchery and a request will be forwarded to the Department concerning this matter.

A resolution will be sent to the Department requesting that notices be posted in post offices advising the opening and closing dates for fishing and hunting in this district. It was felt that the present system is much too confusing and in some cases the regulations were not being received by local license issuers far enough in advance of the season.

One member suggested that some action should be taken to cut down the number of does and fawns taken during the deer season. Another complained against the deer season opening and closing in the middle of the week. He pointed out that the working man only had two week-ends to get out instead of four.

A resolution passed at the meeting asked that a two-day catch of fish in possession be allowed for residents only instead of one day as it is at the present time.

John Knox of North Bay gave an interesting account of his commercial fishing operations for coarse fish in Lake Temiskaming this summer. He said members would be interested to know that a considerable quantity of ling were removed from the lake. Some of these fish measured 3 to 3 1/2 in length and weighed as high as 18 pounds. The ling will eat its own weight in other fish every 48 hours.

A.R. Herbert, MLA introduced Department of Lands and Forest officials who were on hand for Friday's meeting and assured Association members that he would be only too glad to submit personally any briefs or resolu-

tions that the Association wished to have brought before the government committee on Fish and Wildlife of which he was a member. Mr. Herbert paid tribute to the fine services rendered by Association Secretary Treasurer Hugh Grady and the members decided to present him with a suitable gift.

The meeting concluded with several very interesting coloured films followed by refreshments.
