

NOTICE

By-law No. 1020 prohibits the parking of vehicles:

(a) In front of the entrance to a hotel, opposite a public or private lane or private driveway, or in front of entrance to any theatre, auditorium or other building where large assemblages are being held, or for a reasonable time immediately preceding and following such assemblages;

(b) Within ten feet of a fire hydrant;

(c) In such a position as to prevent the convenient removal of any other vehicle previously parked;

(d) Within twenty feet of an intersection.

Parking regulations as herein set forth and as shown by street signs erected, will be enforced.

The Highway Traffic Act, Section 43, in part provides that no person shall park or leave standing any vehicle whether attended or unattended upon any highway in such a manner as to interfere with the movement of other traffic or the clearing of snow from the highway and that a constable upon discovery of any vehicle so parked or left standing may cause it to be moved or taken to or stored in a suitable place and all costs and charges for such removal and storage shall be chargeable to the owner.

This provision of the Act shall be strictly enforced.




