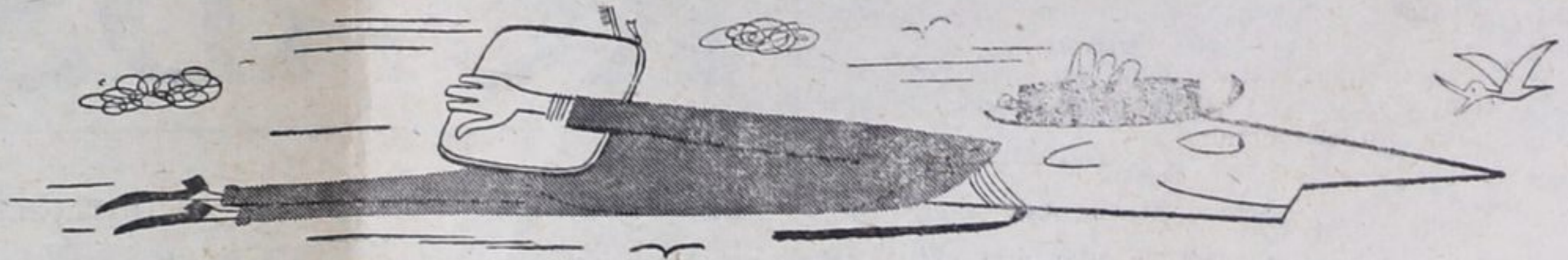
Vandals At Work on Local Golf Course

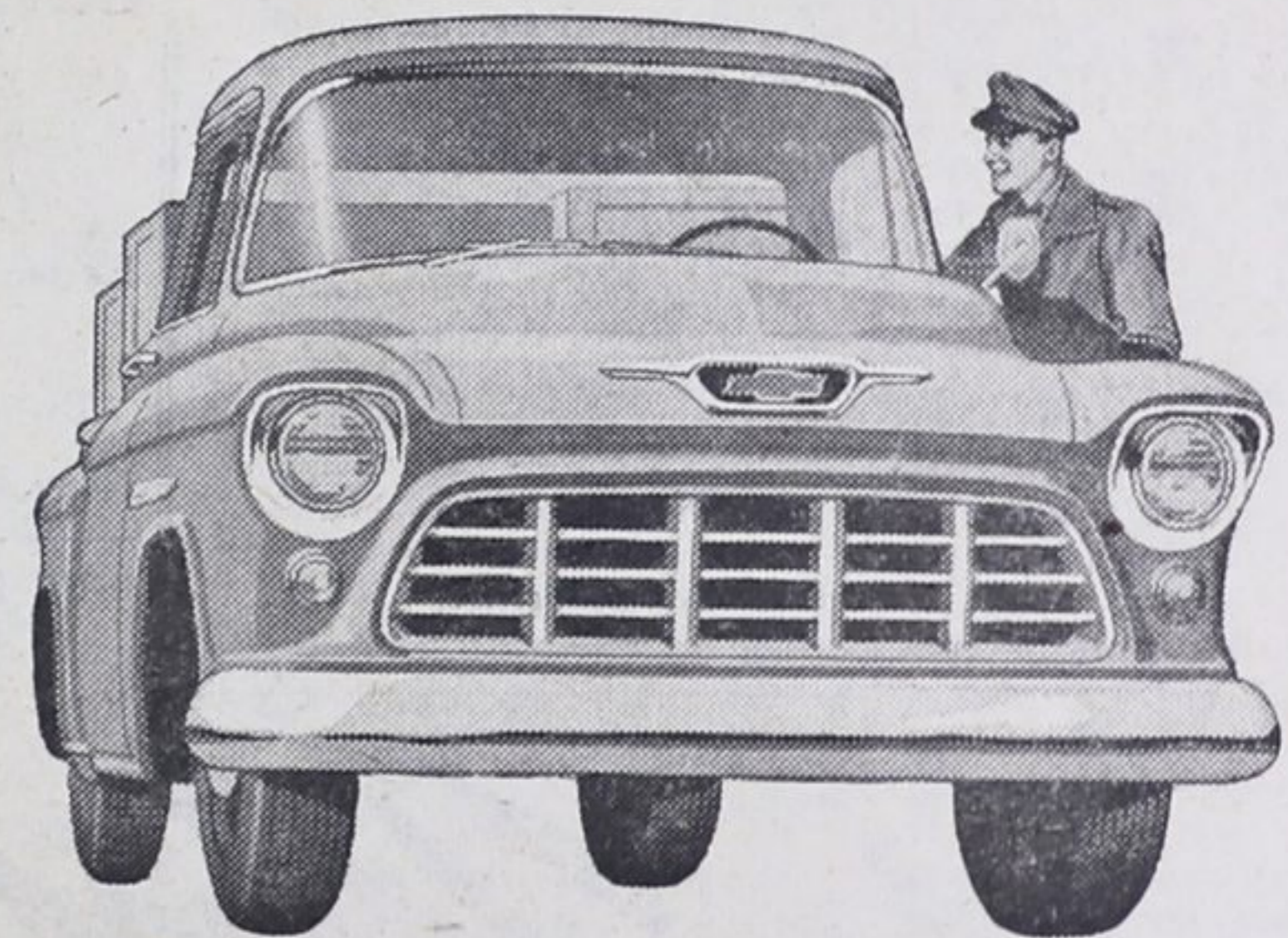
