

## Temagami Area Not Affected By Fumes from Sudbury

The special sulphur dioxide investigating committee empowered by the Ontario Department of Mines to look into claims of damage to forest and farm crops from the smelting operations in the Sudbury Basin, has decided conclusively that these fumes have never contributed to the damage to trees in the Temagami Lake area.

The committee, which met in Toronto on Friday, April 15th, agreed to continue its year round investigation of damage by fumes in a limited area which will exclude Temagami. Seven recorders will continue in operation around the Sudbury smelting area with the most distant 42 miles northeast of the city of Sudbury. Plot observations and growth studies as to both forests and agricultural development will be continued.

One of the more important papers to be read at the meeting was of Dr. Morris Katz of the Defence Research Board.

Douglas and R. H. Murray, the Sulphur Fumes Arbitrator, represented the Ontario Department of Mines.

### Geological Report on Ashmore Township

A comprehensive geological report on one of Ontario's important gold-mining areas will be ready for distribution by the provincial Department of Mines next Monday, April 18th. The report on Ashmore Township, at the east end of the Little Long Lac region was compiled jointly by two of the Department's staff geologists, the late Dr. H.C. Horwood and E. G. Pye, now the resident geologist at Port Arthur. Dr. Horwood made a preliminary survey of the township in 1941 and did further work between 1946 and the time of his death in 1948. Pye completed the survey work in 1950 and subsequently compiled all the data which the two had gathered.

The report outlines the history of mining development in the area, gives a detailed analysis of the geological structures, and describes the mining properties which have been developed.

The report which will be found as Part Five of Volume 60 of the Department's annual reports is accompanied by a colored geological map of the township and level plans of the MacLeod Cockshutt and Hard Rock Mines.

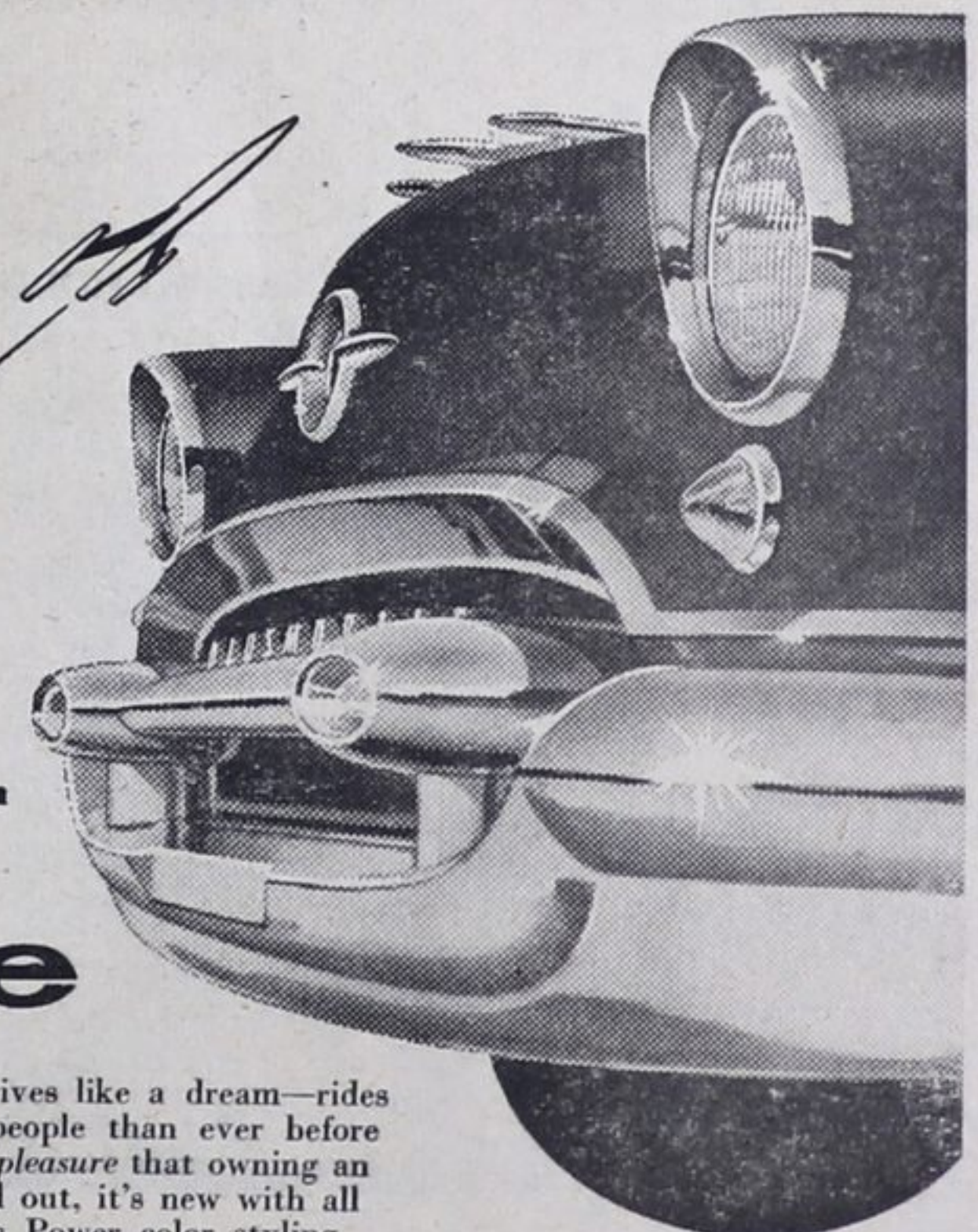
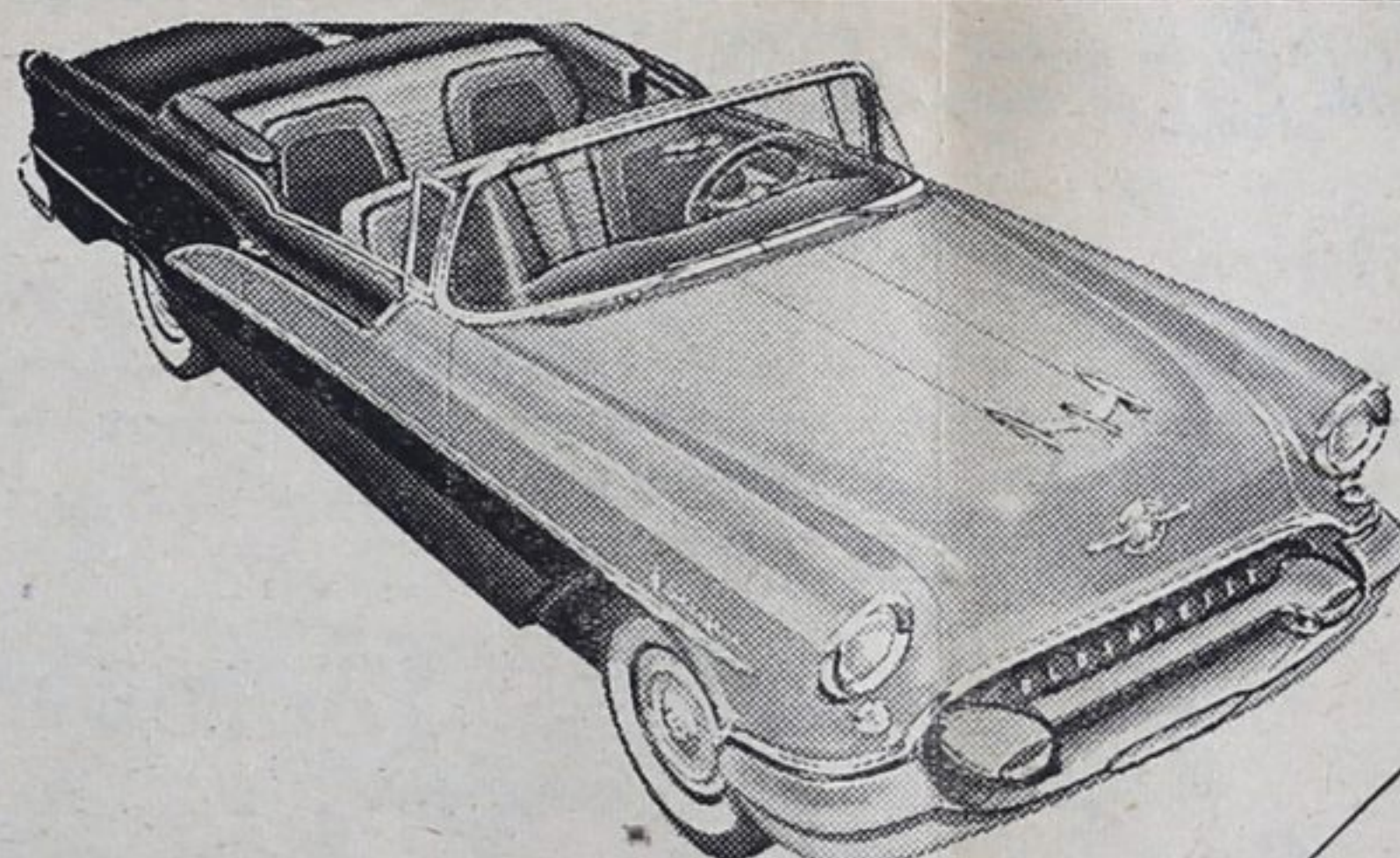

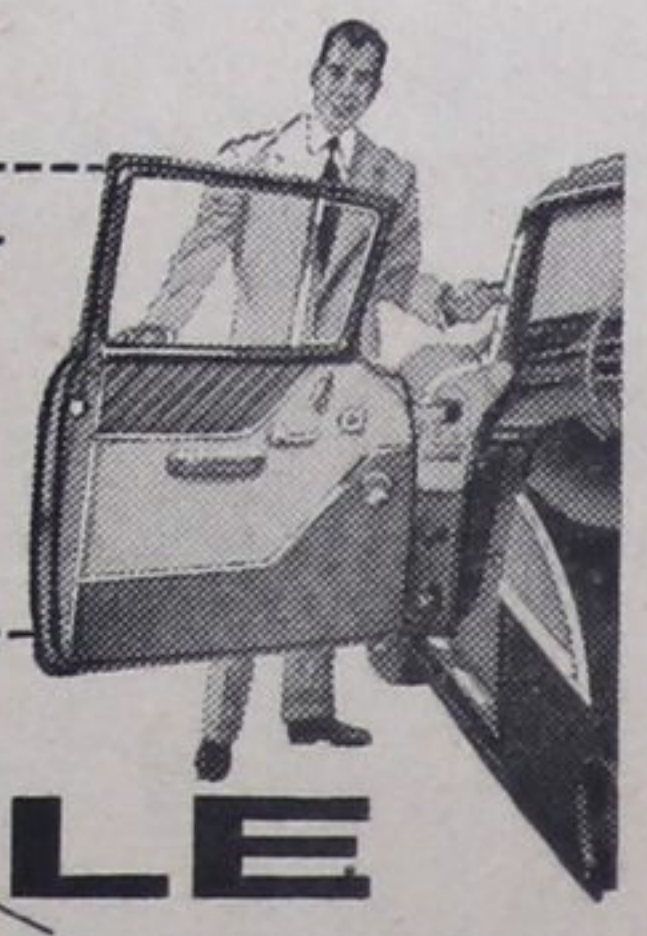
