

Hon. Dana Porter Speaker at P.-C. Meeting Friday.

The Honorable Dana Porter, Attorney-General in the Frost Government spoke to a large audience on Friday last. He said "you had the good sense and wisdom to send a competent man to represent you in the Ontario Legislature, a man with complete confidence in Northern Ontario."

Mr. Porter bluntly named CCF members representing Northern Ontario in the past as "prophets of ruin."
