### Herbert Re-Elected for Second Term in Temiskaming

With only two candidates in the field for the Provincial election there was only a difference of 187 votes cast in comparison to 1951, when there were the three candidates running:

Herbert ..... 4.192 Taylor ..... 3,611 Peters ..... 2,888 A total of 10,691 votes in 1951. In this election Herbert polled 6,339 votes while Ames polled 4,165, a total of 10,504.
