This has resulted in a tremendous waste of water which is gravely interfering with the water pressure throughout the Town and is making it impossible for many people in various parts of the Town to obtain water for demestic purposes.

This practice also reduces the water reserve in the Town Reservoir, and adds to the menace of fire.

The practice of sprinkling lawns except during the permitted hours between 6 and 9 in the morning and the same hours in the evening is strictly forbidden by the Town's By-Law and warning is hereby given that those breaking the law are liable to be prosecuted to the full extent of the law.
