





As a property owner in Haileybury and Bucke, and as a former member of the Bucke council, may I take up space in your paper to appeal to Haileyburians to cooperate with Bucke in getting fire protection for the township.

Apart from purely financial humanitarian ets. considerations, reasons would dictate some change in the present syste.m We cannot wait until half of Bucke is burned down, or until two or three children are burned to death.

The attitude of the present Bucke council is hard to under stand. It is obvious that a fire truck based at North Cobalt would not be much more use than our present arrangement with Cobalt. And the cost of maintaining and training a fire department would be very heavy

The Bucke council, it seems is far from eagar to deal with Haileybury, although the majority of ratepayers in Bucke have made it clear that this is what they

It is perhaps not surprising that Bucke council is failing to take any decisive action. They

haven't even managed to get the tax bills out yet, although we are nearly in August. Perhaps this is because they hate to admit that the tax rate will have to go ap another ten or more mills as a results of their policies.

I believe that every citizen in Bucke should make it clear to the Bucke council that they want proper fire protection, and that an arrangement with Haileybury is the most sensible and logical thing, and will be to the benefit of both communities. And I sincerely hope that citizens of Haileybury will support the proposal.
