

GERMAN GRAIN DELEGATION VISITS CANADA

Ottawa, October 3, 1955—Three senior officials of the Ministry of Food and Agriculture in the Federal Republic of Germany arrived here yesterday for discussions with officers of the Departments of Trade and Commerce and Agriculture. They arrived in Vancouver on September 11 by air from Amsterdam on the invitation of the Canadian Wheat Board, and have been making first-hand studies of the production, grading, milling, storage and merchandising of Canadian wheat and other grains. During their stay in Ottawa, they will visit the Central Experimental Farm, where they will study plant breeding work being undertaken there.

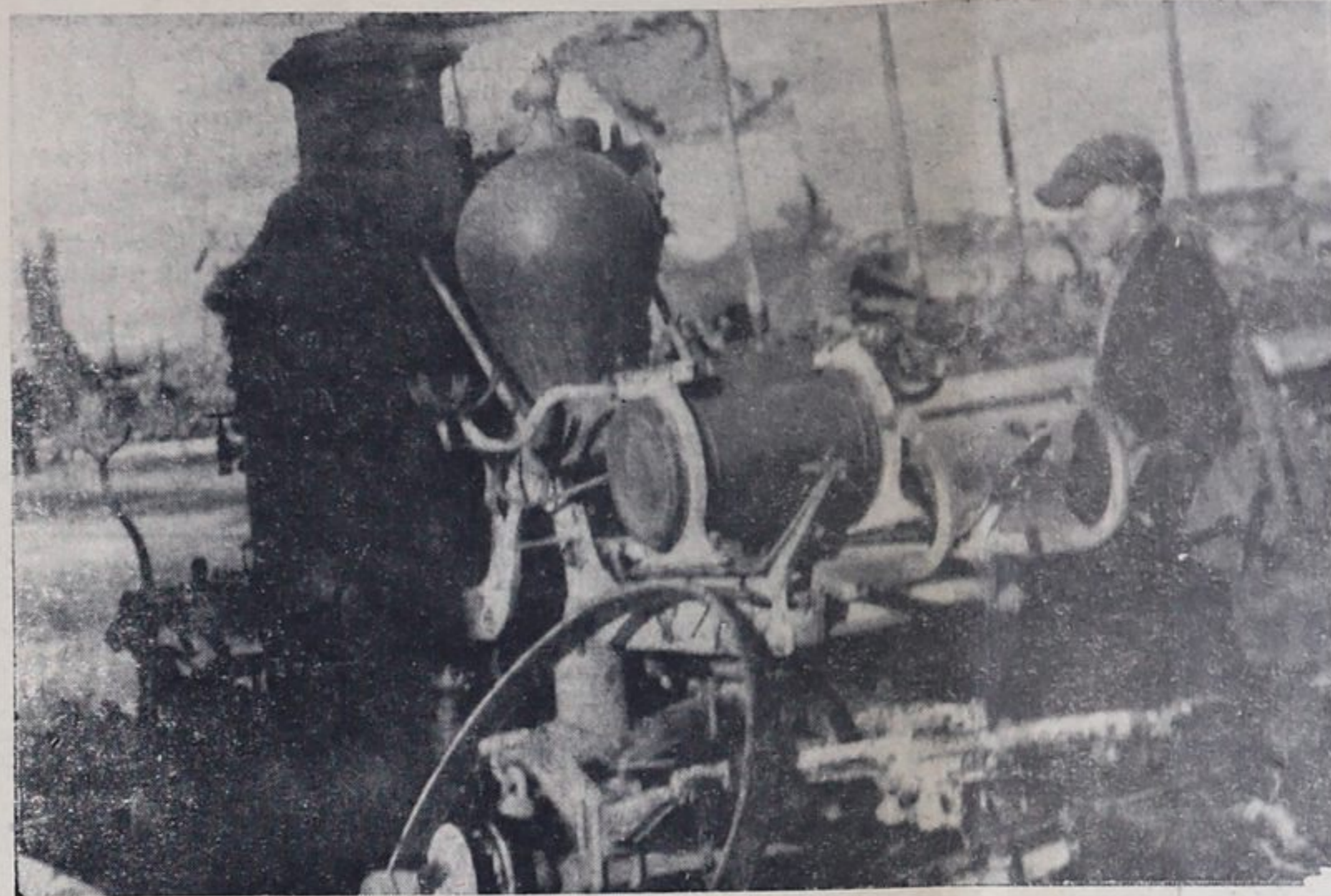

DEER AT RONDEAU

It would be difficult to estimate just how many deer could be harvested in Ontario's Lake Erie district if proper arrangements could be made for general open seasons throughout the various counties, according to Conservation Supervisor E. L. Skuce. "We do not propose," he says, "for the Department of Lands and

Forests, "that all areas the size of Rondeau Provincial Park could produce as many deer as this area does, but it is interesting to know that it has been necessary to control the deer herd at Rondeau Park for the past forty years. "These animals browse on many species of trees and, if there are too many deer in this area, reproduction of desirable species is hindered. Rondeau

Park is one of the few remaining fragments of original forest cover of this region, including black walnut, tulip, sassafras, sycamore, oak and hickory trees. "The area covers approximately 2,000 acres of wooded lands, plus large marshes, and it has continually produced a crop of deer which have been taken off periodically."

NEW RECORD FOR MINES

Last year's total mineral production in Ontario topped half a million for the first time in history. The final compilation of returns released by the Ontario Department of Mines shows the year's total as \$503,757,221.

Of this total \$395,185,129 was made up of the production from metal mines of the province. Non-metallic minerals accounted for another \$13,077,053 of the total. Natural gas and petroleum were produced to the value of \$13,148,609 and structural materials were worth \$82,346,430.

The preliminary total compiled in March by the Dominion Bureau of statistics showed production of just under \$485,000,000 but at that time the Ontario department predicted that final returns would probably be about \$15,000,000 greater.

The total production in 1953, the previous record high, was \$465,877,093.
