OBITUARY

W. J. DOBBINS

Well known to mining men throughout the North, and one of Haileybury's leading citizens, W. J. Dobbins died last Thursday in Misericordia Hospital. He was 72 years old.

Born in Iona, Michigan, Mr. Dobbins graduated from the Michigan School of Mines at Houghton in 1907. He worked at several iron and copper properties in the United States and came to Canada in 1908 and worked for the Canadian Copper Company at Copper Cliff.

One of the pioneer mining men in the Cobalt camp, he came to Cobalt in 1909 and was engineer at the Buffalo and Seneca Superior Mines. During this period he was one of the first mining engineers to examine the newly prospected Dome Mine in the Porcupine camp.

Mr. Dobbins spent several years with a chemical company in Virginia and Tennessee and then ran his own truck farm for three years in Florida. He returned to the north country and managed the Capitol Silver Mine in Gowganda. He managed mining properties in the Amos, Quebec, area and then became manager of the Keeley Mine near Cobalt until it closed. In

1943 he became manager of the Doherty Roadhouse Stock Exchange at Haileybury and held this position until his retirement last March.

In 1911 he was married to the late Dolly Lynch of Peterborough, who predeceased him in 1935. In 1938 Mr. Dobbins married the former Marjorie Briden of Haileybury who survives. A Roman Catholic, Mr. Dobbins was active in many community projects and was particularly interested in the Haileybury Horticultural Society and well known for his gardening activities. Funeral services were held from Haileybury Holy Cross Church at 11 a.m. Saturday. The remains were transported to Peterborough where interment took place Sunday afternoon.

MRS. M. T. WILSON

Mrs. Mary T. Wilson died at her home in Toronto Monday. She will be remembered by many Haileyburians as the wife of the late Dr. D. G. Wilson who was in charge of St. Mary's Sanatorium for many years.
