When doing a repaint job at home on any of the children's toys or furniture, be sure that the paint is free from lead. Most modern toy manufacturers, being well aware of this danger, use a coating for their products that is not harmful but if old paint left around the house from various paint jobs is used, it may not be safe. When buying paint for use on toys, consult the paint dealer as to whether it contains lead.


