At our Nov 22 meeting, we were honoured in having our district governor Ross L. Dobbin as our guest speaker. Other guests attending were Rotarian Jack Gillespie of Peterborough companion of Mr Dobbin, and Val Bizley of North Bay Rotary Club. Around of applause was given to Sid Graham for the work he is doing in the district. His paper had not been in circulation for a few years.

During his speech, Mr Dobbin was very interested in the settlement and growth of this district. The theme of his talk was of the need and the achievements of Rotary in this district and throughout the world. He also stated that although there is always room for more Rotary Clubs and larger memberships, the president of Rotary International, A. Z. Baker, was not too interested in the expansion of Rotary Clubs but the extension of the work which is being done, and to inject more spirit of Rotary into members. M. Doddin admired the Rotary Park and beach, praised the work of our club towards helping crippled children, the Halloween party and was very pleased with the appreciation of our club by many residents in the district. He could also foresee an economic change with the coming Natural Gas line and the need for silver and cobalt in industry. The district governor noticed the individuality which exists in our club and was pleased with the influence it has in the district. In the east Rotary is a spearhead to education and health and in time of war or trouble Rotary is a go-between.

These were the final statements left to us by Mr. Dobbin who was thanked by Dr. Arnold in a closing speech at the meeting.

He also spoke of the importance of the pipe line in the North.

In introducing Mr. Marsh, who is with the Northeastern Ontario Development Association, Mr. years ago, Mr. Marsh's Father Gamble mentioned that fifty opened the Imperial Bank in Cobalt. Mr. Marsh outlined the district he covers which extends from Parry Sound north to James Bay, and from Mattawa west to Sault St Marie. After a brief explanation and purpose of the Association a motion, that the Haileybury Chamber of Commerce, of whom many members were present, join this association, which was unanimously carried.

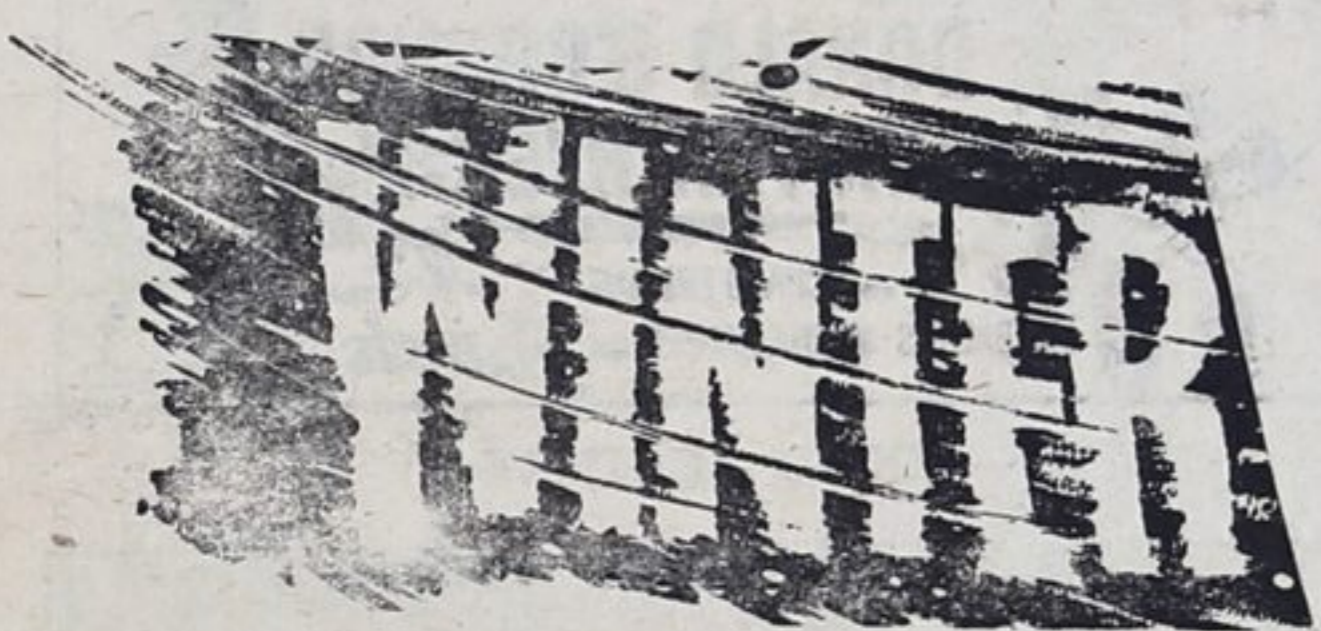
