Pedestrians in November

The record shows that pedestrians are in more danger of being killed or injured in traffic collisions during November than at other times of the year. Last November, of the 102 fatalities which occurred on the streets and highways of Ontario, 45 were pedestrians. In only two cases does it appear that the fatally injured person had little or no chance to avoid being hit... when cars mounted the curb or ran onto the road shoulder.

Of the balance, some failed to walk facing traffic and did not get of the road surface as cars approached. Dark clothing rendered some victims practically invisible to drivers. They stepped out on the roadway from behind parked cars or trucks. They attempted to cross between intersections. Some elderly people were reported as "apparently confused" and attempted to cross the road with traffic approaching.
