### OBITUARY

One of the district's pioneers, Alexander Lorne Herbert died at his Brewster street home Saturday morning. He was in his 76th year, and had been in poor health for several months.

Mr. Herbert was the first ONR station agent at Cobalt, organizer of many mining ventures, and owner of extensive coal and fuel oil interests in the north.

He came north with the ONR, and was the first station agent at Cobalt. Later he went into business for himself, and operated a custom brokerage business. In later years he was to become a director of the Dominion Custom Brokers' Association He was interested in many mining ventures, and was president of Bidgood-Kirkland Gold Mines, vice-president of the Cuptau Mines, and president of the Hebert Mining Corporation, which has properties in the Clericy, Quebec, area.

He was active for many years in the Canadian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy, and was a charter member and former president of the Cobalt Kiwanis Club was also a life member of the Haileybury Masonic Lodge. The from Cobalt, Haileybury and New Liskeard gathered Sunday for Masonic rites at Tullock's funeral home.

Mr. Herbert was a strong Conservative all his life, and his son Bob, is Progressive Conservative member for Temiskaming in the provincial legislature.

Mr. Hebert was born in Granby, Quebec, the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Alexander Herbert. He is survived by his wife, the former Albertine David of Buckingham, Quebec; three sons, Alexander Robert, Cobalt; David Miner and George Rowat of Haileybury; and three daughters, Amie Marie, Mrs. J. Brearley, Barrie, Ont., Lorna, Mrs. W. J. Burke, Quoyon, Quebec, and Albertine, Mrs. Camille Vezina, of Cobalt.
