General Contract Given For Hotel Completion

The general contract for completion of the 21-storey Queen Elizabeth Hotel in Montreal has been awarded to Pigott Construction Co. Ltd.

Donald Gordan, chairman and president of the Canadian National Railways, announced the awarding of the contract following a meeting of the CNR Board of Directors. The Pigott tender was the lowest of five tenders received.

As previously announced, the hotel is expected to be completed in 1958. Steelwork is two-thirds complete, and the general contractor was expected to start pouring the concrete floor slabs early in the New Year.

The Queen Elizabeth, part of a huge development planned for the CNR's 20 acre terminal site in the heart of downtown Montreal, will have approximately 12 00 guest rooms, and public rooms capable of seating 2500 persons at banquets and 4000 at meetings. It has been planned primarily as a convention center.

The Bible Today

Twenty-year drama of translating the whole Bible into Ukrainian ended recently in Winnipeg, Canada has the Bible available in over 100 languages and dialects and today it is rare to find further translation work in progress here.

Steeped in intrigue this drama, last act begun in 1935 and the curtain fell only last year.

Its early scenes were set up in Europe. Its hero, Dr. Ilarion Ohienko, professor of Kiev University in the Ukraine, began making notes and collecting source material thirty years earlier while working in Warsaw University.

The story reads like a Odyssey After years of effort his task was interrupted with the outbreak of the Second World War. Then some of his precious notes and manuscripts were burned. There followed a flight through Poland to Czechoslovakia and on to a monastery in Austria. Thus the monastery of the carefully preserved work was smuggled from place to place until it finally reached Switzerland. There it was rescued by some British soldiers who sent it to Dr. Ohienko. By that time he had reached Canada.

Since 1950 until the translation was completed, aided by two American Ukrainian scholars, Dr. Ohienko has laboured to put this new version of the Bible into the hands of his people.

The British and Foreign Bible Society has now begun its production and distribution. This Society which has 16 Auxiliaries across Canada has been responsible for 75 per cent of the work of translating and publishing the Bible around the world.

First 'Show Train' Will Run Feb. 5

The first 'Show Train' will leave CNR Central Station in Montreal on Feb. 5, carrying a band of theatregoers on a planned excursion to New York.

The all-inclusive \$105 fare covers transportation, hotel accommodation, and tickets to four Broadway hit shows. The tickets have already been reserved by a New York theatrical agent who is planning the 'show train' in co-operation with the CNR.

The first party, leaving on Feb. 5, will return to Montreal six days later. In the meantime, they will have seen such hits as 'Weave For The Prosecution' and 'Damn Yankees', as well as other plays, a musical stage show, and a first-run movie version of 'Oklahoma!'

PICTURES ARE REMEMBERED
