EDITORIAL

Readers will no doubt notice that our masthead has changed. Actually, we have only reverted to what the Haileyburian was known as during the 1920's, when for a number of years it operated as the Haileyburian and Cobalt Weekly Post.

There will not be any restriction of Haileybury news, but rather an overall expansion of news coverage. Our circulation has been increasing steadily during the past few months, particularly in the Cobalt area, and this step was inevitable.

We did not make the change without a good deal of thought, but it is dictated by a number of circumstances.

In the first place, it is not secret that the publisher of this newspaper resides in Cobalt, and has many Cobalt interests.

Secondly, a great many business people and ordinary citizens in the Cobalt camp have requested us during the past year to expand our operations. They feel that the interests of Haileybury and Cobalt are closely bound together, and if the two towns are to prosper, and resist competition, they must work together.

The Cobalt-Haileybury Curling Club, the Northern Ski Club, and other projects are examples of close co-operation between Cobalt and Haileybury.

Many business people in Haileybury have also intimated that they would welcome any move to bring closer cooperation between the two towns. With rancor or jealousy, it is fair to point out that both commerce and new industries have been passing both towns by in recent years, settling a few miles to the north in the extremely pro-

perous center of New Liskeard. There is absolutely no reason why Haileybury, North Cobalt, and Cobalt should not expand, should not attract industry or major commercial enterprises. We make no apologies for stating bluntly that we are prejudiced in favor of Haileybury and Cobalt, and have every intention of placing the interests of these two communities ahead of all other considerations. We shall no doubt be damned and bedeviled for this stand, but it will not be a new experience.

O.N.R. Earning Up For December

Net earnings for December of 1956 realized by the Ontario Northland Railway amounted to \$93,206, marking a \$2,520 increase over the December of 1955 total of \$90,685, it was announced today.

Gross earnings for December of 1955 were \$1,238,656, while the December 1956 gross was \$1,264,046; December of 1955 expenses were \$1,147,971 in comparison to the \$1,170,839 total for December of 1957; and net gain for December of 1955 was \$90,685 in comparison to the December of 1956 net of \$206.

Accumulative January to December of 1956, the net profit amounted to \$2,003,361, marking a \$475,154 gain over the 1955 accumulative net total of \$1,528,207.

Remember the Haydn Orchestra concert Tuesday February 26, in the schools' auditorium. Sponsored by the Haileybury Home and School Association.

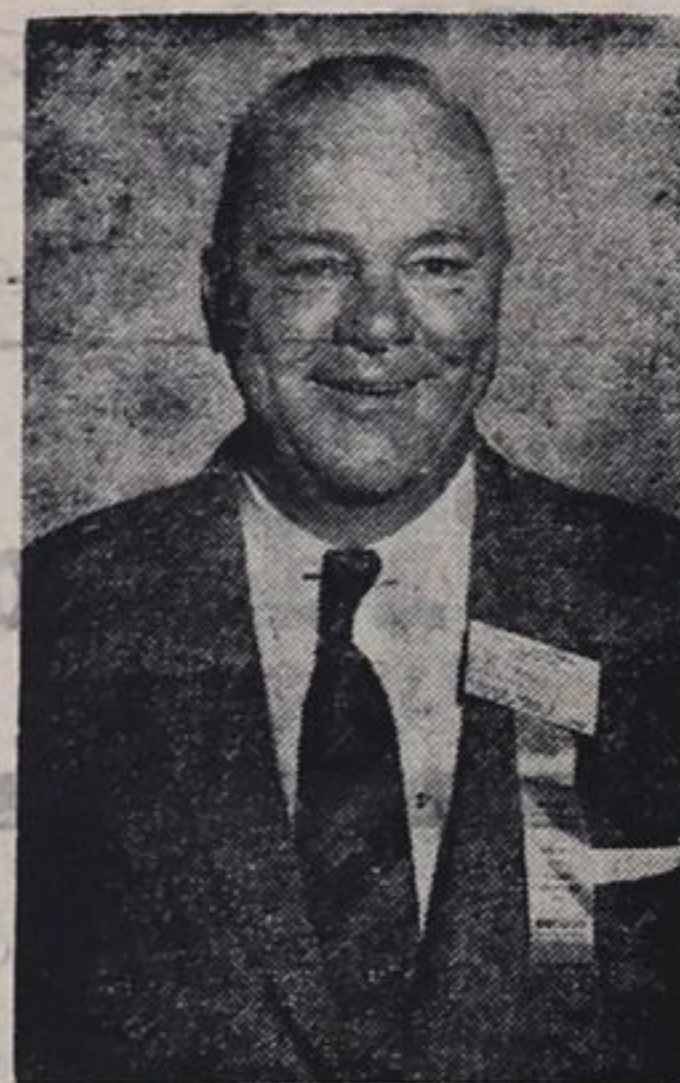
The Haileybury Figure Skating Club will hold a meeting in the Blue Room of the Hotel Haileybury on Monday February 25, at 8 p.m.
