In reply to a telegram of enquiry sent by this paper, W. Griesinger Ontario minister of public works, has replied that tenders for the extension to the Provincial Institute of Mines will be called for in about one month. However, Mr. Griesinger's letter did not indicate whether a start will be made to the construction this year.

The text of Mr. Griesinger's reply follows:

"Replying to your telegram pertaining to the Mining School at Haileybury, I am pleased to give you the following information:

This subject is being handled by Critchley and Delean, our Associate Architects in North Bay, and the drawings are now complete.

General Structural Trades Specifications have been checked and our comments forwarded to the Associate Architects on September 10th, 1957.

Electrical and Mechanical Specifications are being checked at the present time and comments will be forwarded to the Architects this week, and it is felt that they may require re-writing which may cause another short delay.

However, it is expected that we will be in a position to call for tenders in about one month's time.

Trusting this gives you the desired information".

North Fooled Claims Ames

Northern Ontario was played for a sucker, according to C. C. Ames, CCF organizer in the north. Mr. Ames said in an interview in Cobalt Tuesday, that municipal councils and other organizations were completely fooled by the Northern Ontario Natural Gas Company.

Northern towns were asked to support the Northern Ontario Natural Gas Company, and told that northern people would be given the chance of investing in the company, he said.

"In fact, a few promoters have made fantastic profits and northern Ontario's citizens have had no chance to buy stock except at today's highly priced market quotations."

Mr. Ames referred to a recent analysis made by the Canadian Brotherhood Employees. This showed that Ralph K. Farris, president of Northern Ontario Natural Gas, made \$750,000 (seven hundred and fifty thousand) from an investment of \$300 (three hundred). Mr. Farris reserved 37,500 shares at four fifths of a cent each, which is now selling at \$20 per share, or 2,500 times what he paid for it.

Gordon K. MacLean of Edmonton paid \$5,287 for holdings now worth \$2,115,000. C. Spencer Clark of Seattle, paid \$6,725 for stock worth \$1,120,000 today.

"These figures may show that it advocated public ownership of the gas lines," Mr. Ames said. The CCF was not so crazy when "A great many people in the north worked to help the northern Ontario natural gas company, and now they can see that all they did was to line the pockets of the promoters with fantastic profits," he added.
