Chief Watson urges that fire prevention be practiced in every home by:

1. Inspecting and cleaning the chimney at least once a year.
2. Keeping heating apparatus clean and replacing worn or defective parts promptly.
3. Repairing electrical equipment by qualified electricians at the first sign of trouble. Replace frayed cords on appliances. Don't overload circuits.
4. Being careful with cigarettes & matches. Keep matches out of reach of children.
5. Using fire-resistant roofing, such as asphalt singles, which gives protection against flying sparks from the chimney or other sources.
6. Cleaning combustible rubbish out of closets, the attic and basement. Turn in rags, paper and magazines for salvage.
7. Being careful with flammable liquids. Never take gasoline into the home for any purpose. Use a Non-explosive and non-burning fluid such as carbon tetrachloride for removing spots from clothing.

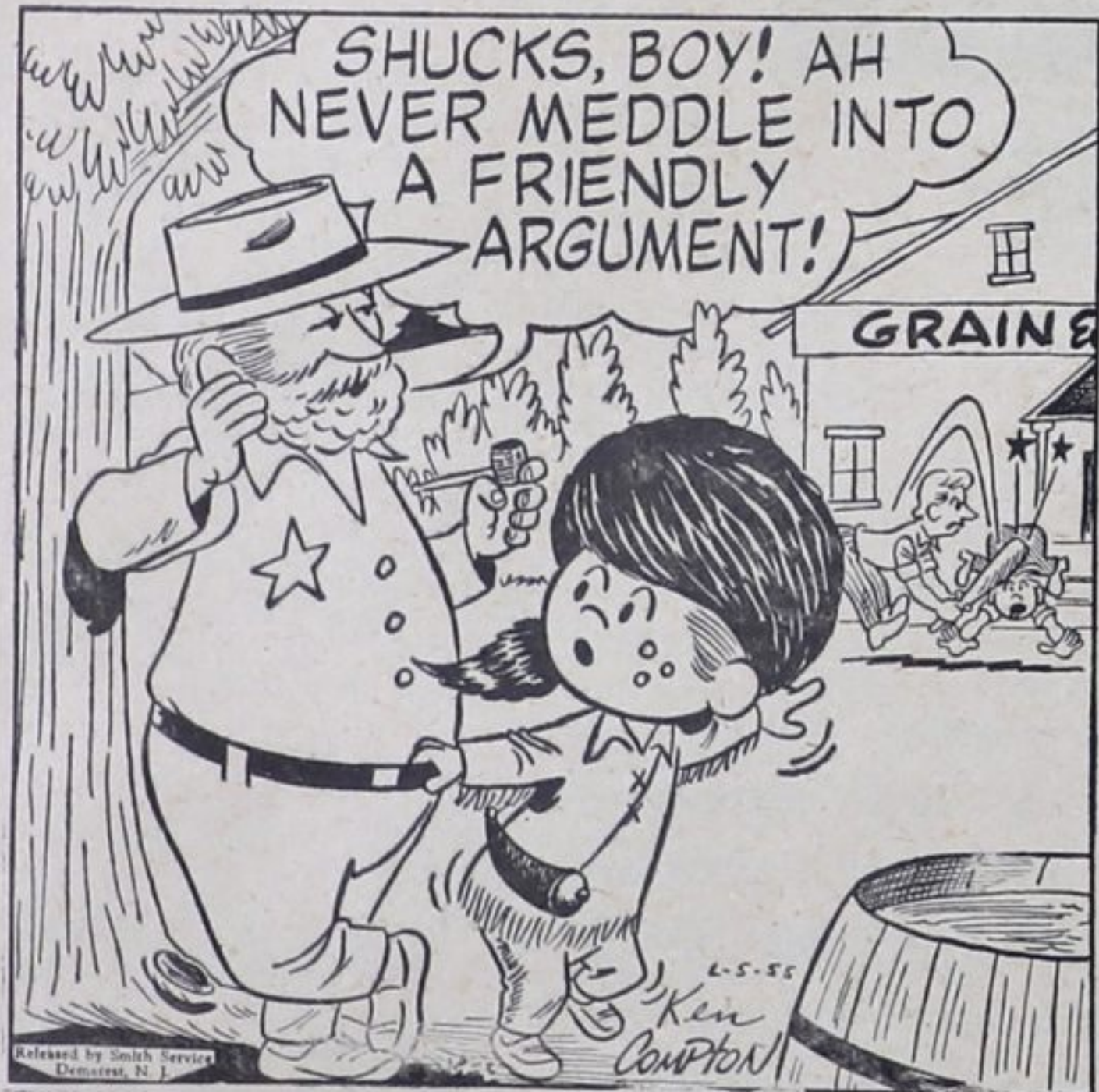
