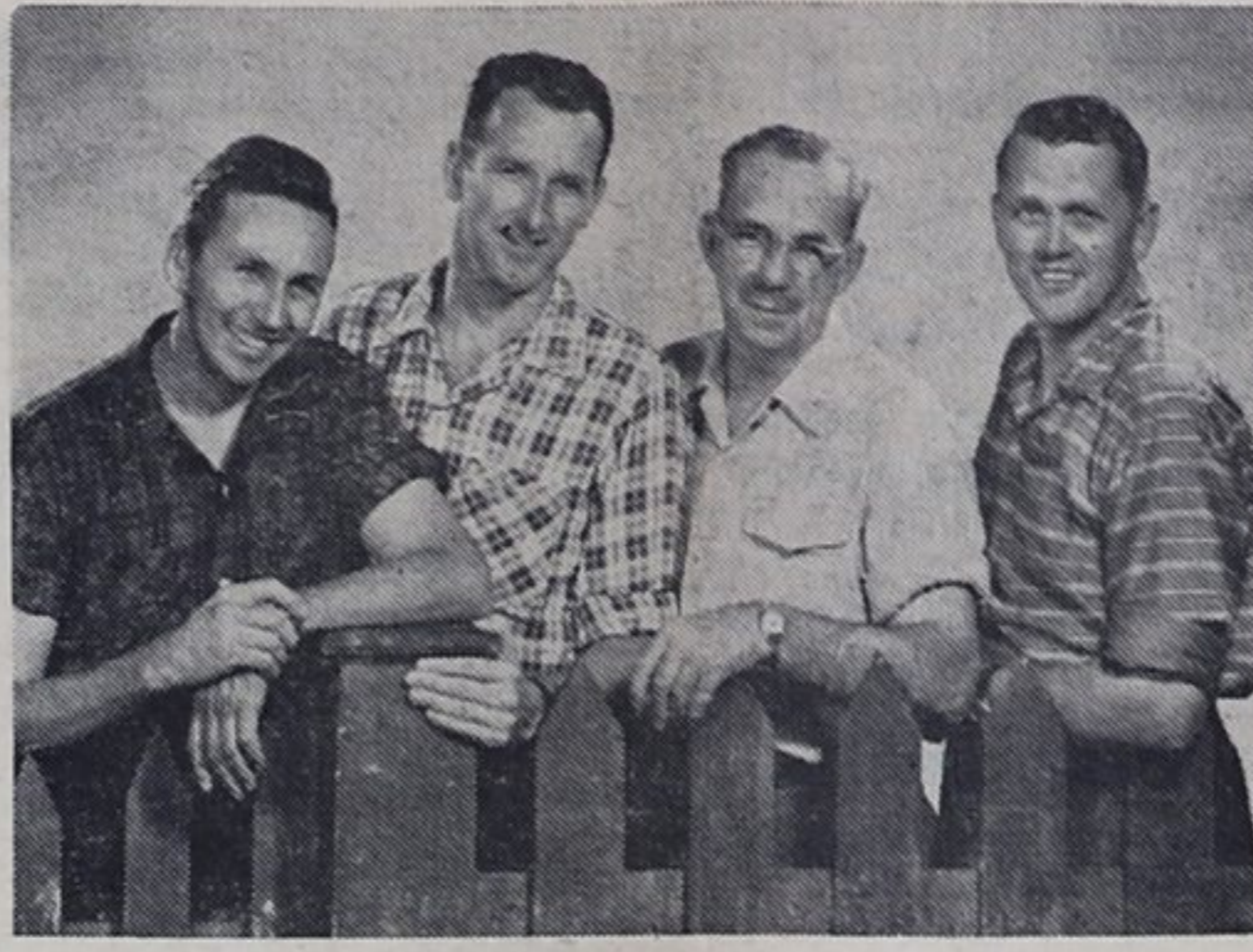
The Jr. Room posed a riddle as they sang "Who is Coming on Christmas Night?"
