Fluoridation Favored

The Temiskaming Health Unit is in favor of fluoridation of water as a measure to prevent tooth decay has probably been debated more than any proposed health measure in recent years.

A brief explaning fluoridation was issued in 1951 to district municipalities.

While at least two towns favored fluoridation, none of the communities were prepared, at that time, to undertake the cost of the service.

Today about one million Canadians are reaping the benefits of communities. Many thousands more people have been drinking naturally fluoridated water all


