Dear Sir:—

We have received notice from the Chief of Fish and Wild-life Division, Department of Lands and Forests, Ontario, of the passing of the following Provincial regulation effective 1959:—

"All applicants for their first hunting license will be required to complete a test in the safe handling of fire-arms. When completed, they will then be issued a certificate of competence which will be required when application for purchase of permit is made."

In keeping with this new regulation which required instruction has been assigned to the various sport clubs of the Province and plans for the future development of a junior membership in our association for all interested children of fourteen years and over covering education in gun safety, conservation and forest fire prevention, we are prepared to give this course to all junior outdoor enthusiasts. Courses will be held June 4 and June 6, in auditorium of Public School North Cobalt from 7:00 p.m., to 9:00 p.m. and on Saturday June 7, on a firing range.

We wish to extend a welcome also to any adults who may be interested in this course. As you would understand, the education derived from this course will not only be a great asset to the individual for the purpose, but will also be a greater asset to the community and the nation as a whole.

Your co-operation in this movement will be greatly appreciated.

WILL CONDUCT MUSIC EXAMINATIONS

Composer, organist and the several years been head of the orist, Dr. Eugene Hill has for Theory Department, University Organist, and Professor of Organ at Miami University, Oxford, Ohio. Prior to this he was on the Faculty of the Royal Conservatory of Music of Toronto, and has conducted Conservatory examinations for many years.

Born in Toronto, Dr. Hill obtained his music education in Winnipeg, and Toronto, and latterly in London, England at the Royal Academy. He was awarded the degree of Doctor of Music from the University of Toronto in 1946.

Dr. Hill is becoming increasingly well-known as a composer of choral, orchestral, organ and piano works. His "Legend" for orchestra has been performed by the Oklahoma Symphony Orchestra and the Toronto Symphony Orchestra under Sir Ernest MacMillan, his "Music for Orchestra" by Thor Johnson and the Cincinnati Symphony, and many of his compositions have been presented by the C.B.C.

LANDS AND/OR MINING RIGHTS TO BE FORFEITED FOR ACREAGE TAX ARREARS

PURSUANT to the provisions of Subsection 2, Section 219 of The Mining Amendment Act, the following list of lands and mining rights in respect of which acreage tax, penalties and costs to December 31st, 1957, imposed by the said Act are two years or more in default, notice is hereby given that unless the amount due as shown is paid on or before December 31st, 1958, on the day following shall be forfeited to and vested in the Crown, but shall not be open for prospecting, staking out, sale or lease until published in one issue of THE ONTARIO GAZETTE.
