Hon. J. W. Spooner Speaks To Mining Graduates

The Hon. J. W. Spooner, Minister of Mines, was the guest speaker at the thirteenth annual graduation dinner which was held at the Cobalt Community Hall on Saturday evening last. The occasion marked the completion of another successful year at the Provincial Institute of Mining which opened under auspices of the Provincial Government in 1945.

In his address, Mr. Spooner emphasized the important contribution which the Haileybury Mining School had made to the mining industry and named many men prominent in mining to-day who had received their special training at the local school. Despite a temporary curtailment in mining, Mr. Spooner pointed out that good opportunities for trained men continue and advancement is assured for those who have successfully completed the mining course. The addition to the mining school which is scheduled for construction this summer will provide more laboratory, classroom, office and storage space to facilitate the important work of the school, he stated.

Mr. Spooner was introduced by Mr. Omer Lafontaine, member of the Institute's Advisory Committee, and General Superintendent of Coniurum Mines. The Board of the Institute was represented by Mr. N. Morissette of Haileybury who has been on the governing body of the Institute since its opening.

Prizes were presented to high ranking students by the members of the Institute's Advisory Committee; T. A. McDonough and M. R. MacPherson of Kirkland Lake. E. E. Campbell of Cobalt, and W. J. Marshall L. K. Walkom, S. G. Ireland, and R. F. Dewar of the Porcupine. Don Coughlin of Noranda, president of the students' council presided at the dinner.
