TENDERS

Ontario Northland Transportation Commission-Tenders for purchase of lands at Temagami Townsite, Strathly Township, District of Nipissing.

Sealed Tenders properly marked on the outside as to contents and addressed to A. Jardine, General Manager, Ontario Northland Transportation Commission at North Bay, Ontario, will be received up to 12 o'clock noon on Thursday, July 27th, 1958, for the purchase of Part Parcel 16810, in the Register for Nipissing and being approximately 6 acres in Blocks B and C Plan M-251 registered in the Office of Land Titles at North Bay and being lands situate in the Townsite of Temagami in that portion east of the Ontario Northland Railway. Mines, Minerals and Mining rights will be reserved. The subject property fronts on the Station Grounds of the Ontario Northland Railway for approximately 250 feet; make one block and will be sold as such.

Easements for access roads, water supply lines will be conveyed with the title but cost of all surveys and construction of roads etc. will be borne by the purchaser.

A certified cheque for 15% of the amount of the tender, made payable to the Commission, shall accompany each tender, and this will be returned to unsuccessful tenderers.
