
Senior Appointments

Ira Dilworth, 64, of Toronto has been named CBC's director of program evaluation and his successor as director for Ontario and English networks is H. G. Walker, 50, of Toronto. CBC's general manager, J. A. Ouimet, said that Mr. Dilworth's new duties lie in the general area of continuing program assessment; he will also act as consultant to the controller of broadcasting, Charles Jennings, on long-term policy matters. Mr. Dilworth spent most of his early years in British Columbia and was a professor of English at the University of British Columbia before joining the CBC in Vancouver in 1938; he was supervisor of the CBC International Service from 1947-51 and became CBC director for Ontario in 1953. Mr. Walker, active in broadcasting since 1930, helped establish the CBC Dominion network in 1944, and since 1955 has been assistant director for Ontario and English networks.
