#### Fire Destroys Mail For Quebec Towns

No reason has been found for the mysterious blaze that destroyed the loaded express and mail truck on the Ville Marie Highway last Friday afternoon.

Driver Marcel Authier told police that he had loaded his truck as usual at the ONR station in Liskeard and immediately started for Ville Marie.

About six miles from town he noticed increasing heat on the back of his neck, and stopped the truck to investigate.

When he opened the rear door of the truck flames and smoke swept into his face, and he was unable to do more than grab a few bags before the extreme heat drove him from the truck.

New Liskeard Fire Department sent two fire extinguishers to the truck, but the fire was so far advanced that it was useless to try and save it or the mail.

Later the department sent out a truck to extinguish the blaze and remove the truck so that traffic stalled on the highway could drive through. Police halted traffic, fearing an explosion.

The truck, which was totally destroyed, is owned by Eugene Chenier of Ville Marie.

Flames from the truck ignited a nearby pasture, and threatened to start a more serious fire in a tumbledown barn before the fire truck arrived.

The blaze destroyed a shipment of watches, catalogues, but the rumour that baby bonus and pension cheques were also lost was discounted by postal officials.
