John Armstrong arrived in the settlement, which was eventually to become the Town of New Liskeard, in the year 1893. He later became the town's first mayor. As a farmer his faith in his adopted country was justified when a sample of wheat taken from a test plot grown on land on which the High School is now located, was sent to the Canadian National Exhibition, and captured first prize. The prize winning wheat sample was then sent to the Chicago World Fair and once again was adjudged first place. The pinnacle of achievement was reached when, at the Paris Exposition the same year, the sample received the coveted blue ribbon of the Exposition for its class. Thus, then,


