Miss Way suffered a heart attack on May 5 and passed away on Wednesday, May 6. She was born February 23, 1897, in Windsor and was raised and received part of her education in Cobalt. Leaving Cobalt

in 1923, she moved to California settling in the Los Angeles area in 1927 and since 1951 has resided at 824 Buena Vista Road, Santa Barbara. The daughter of the late David H. Way and Ida M. Way she is survived by three brothers Clarence M. Way of Studio City, California and two brothers living in the East; one sister, Margaret, Camp of Pasadena, Calif. Miss Way was a registered nurse, a member of the Santa Barbara Toastmistress Club and E.S.A.

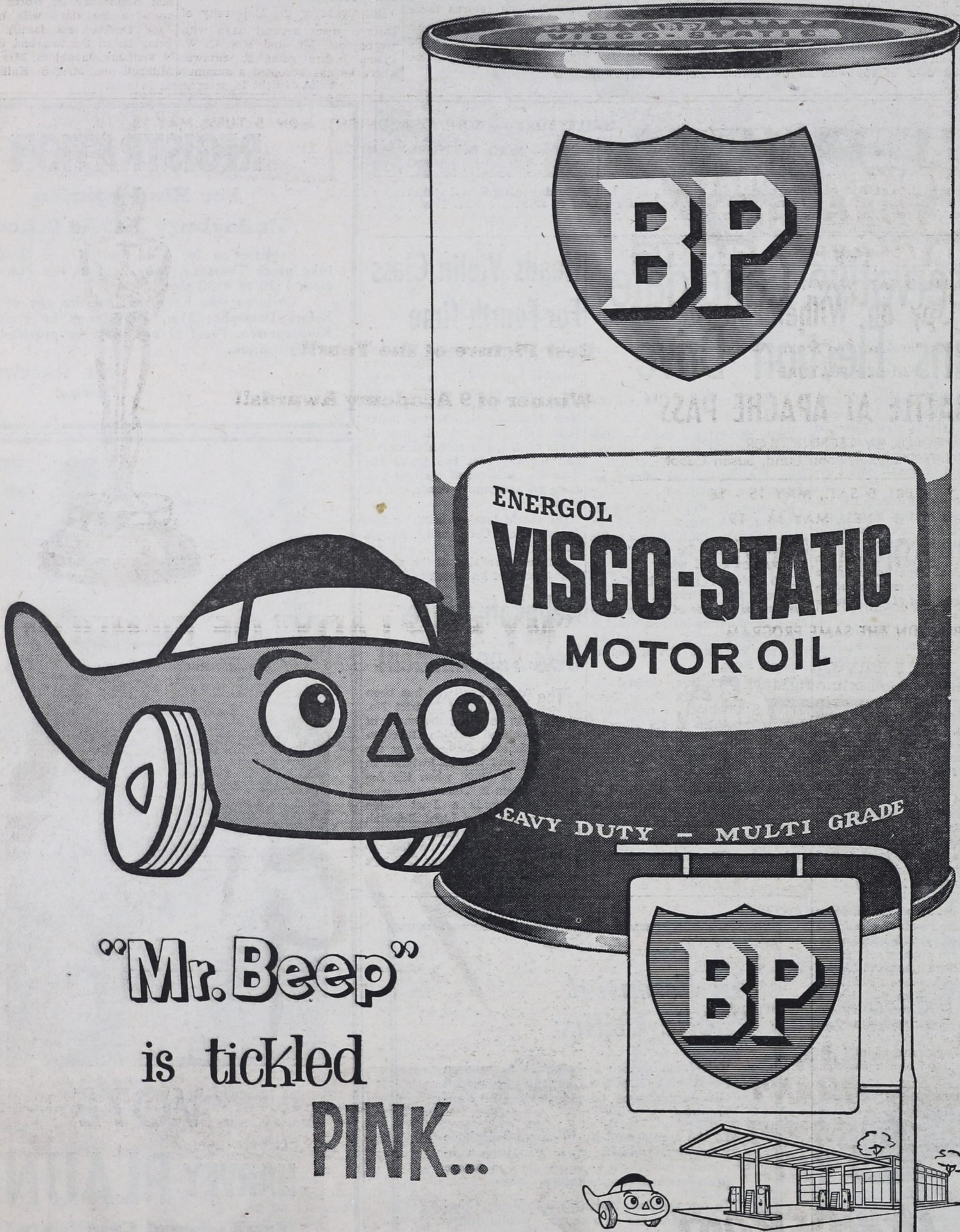
