MUNICIPAL AID

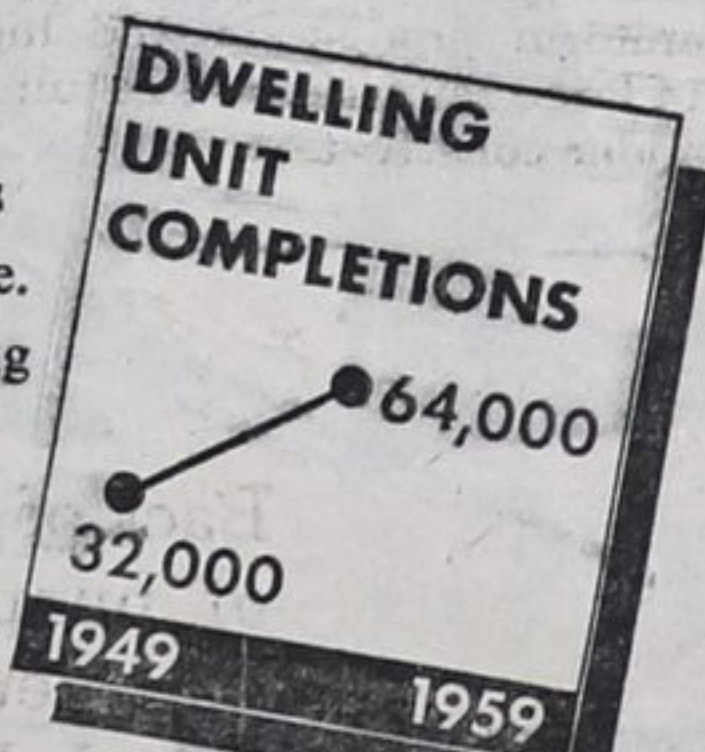
P-C Government policies have lightened the burden on every municipal taxpayer. Provincial aid has increased from \$82 million to \$310 million annually in ten years.
