
"Sidewalk superintendents can expect to see something of a different nature in pipeline construction this summer, Mr. Hove, Chief Engineer for Northern Ontario Natural Gas Company said. There is an active pipeline construction program underway at present, but inconveniences experienced last summer will be virtually non-existent this season. The laying of some 565 odd services will mean contractors working from the lanes and sidewalks to the home — off he street.

The most modern equipment available — manned by workmen hired from local areas — will be employed on the project, to complete the work as quickly as possible with a minimum of inconvenience, according to Mr. Hove.

Underground boring for gas lines, will replace open trench excavations, soil conditions permiting, whenever it is necessary to run a service line from a street main laid near the curb to a customer's home on the opposite side of the street.

For straight line construction, however, the latest conventional trenching methods will be used.
