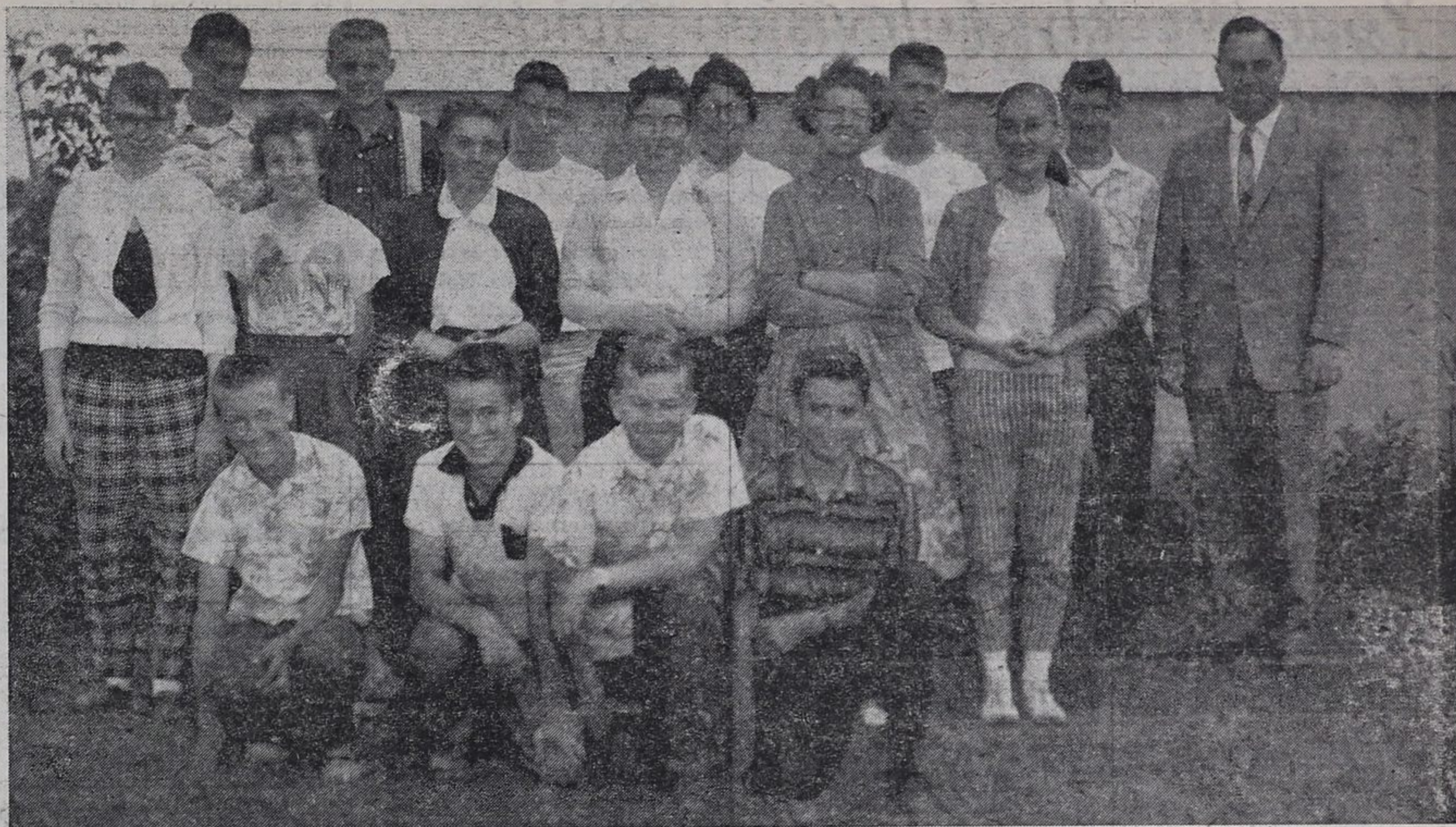

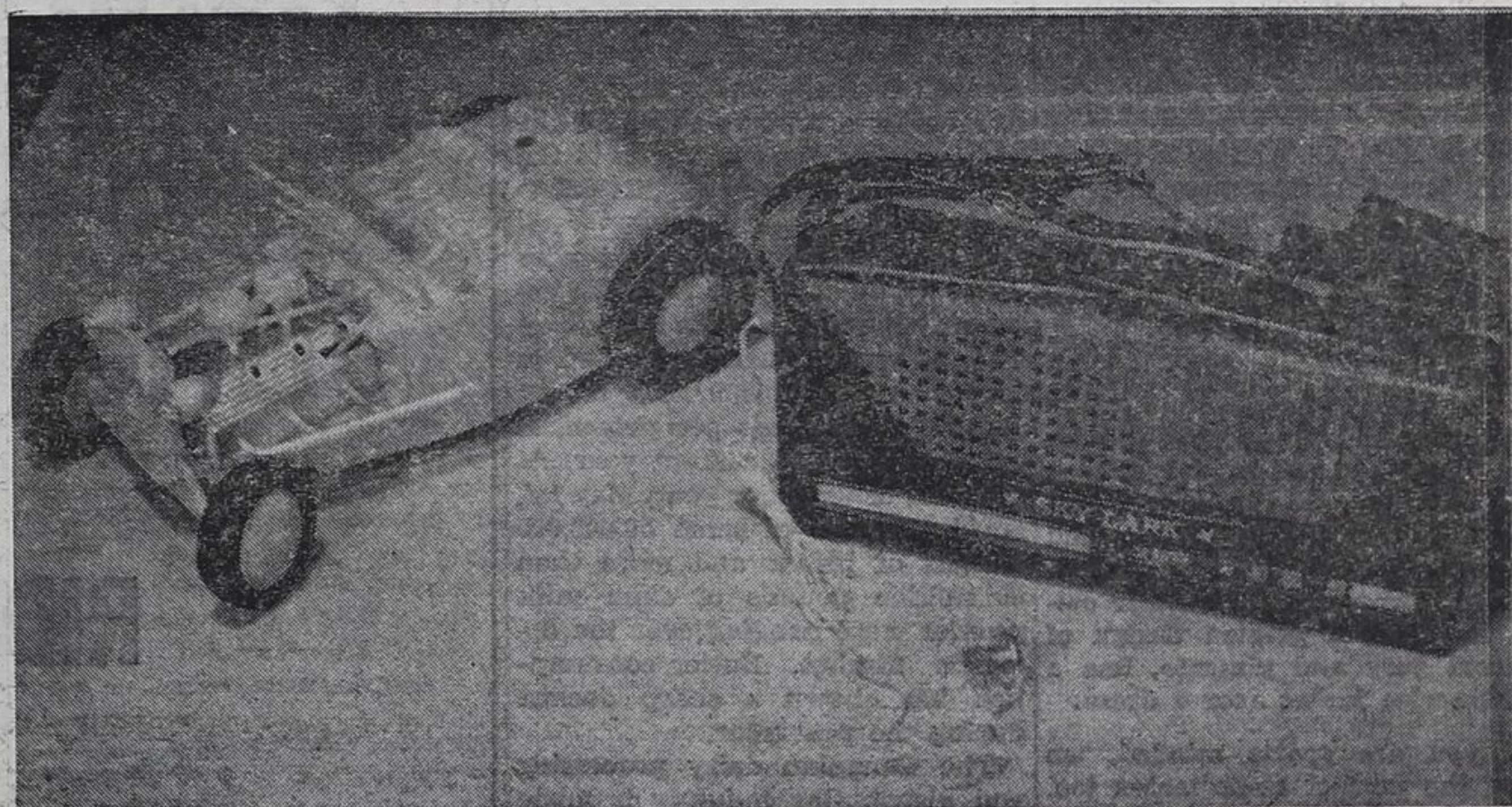
Be sure you are on hand, to give the girls a hand.
